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| 9 | Relating to scholarships; to establish a program to |
| 10 | grant tuition money to dependents of law enforcement officers |
| 11 | for use in participating public or private institutions of |
| 12 | higher education in the State of Alabama; to provide |
| 13 | requirements for scholarship eligibility; to provide |
| 14 | scholarship conditions and terms; to provide for |
| 15 | administration of the program by the Alabama Commission on |
| 16 | Higher Education; to establish the Alabama Law Enforcement |
| 17 | Officers Family Scholarship Fund; and to establish a |
| 18 | distinctive blackout license plate to help fund the |
| 19 | scholarship program. |
| 20 | BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA: |
| 21 | Section 1. Article 11, commencing with Section |
| 22 | 36-21-220, is added to Chapter 21 of Title 36, Code of Alabama |
| 23 | 1975, to read as follows: |
| 24 | Article 11. |
| 25 | §36-21-220 |
| 26 | This article shall be known and cited as the Alabama |
| 27 | Law Enforcement Officers' Family Scholarship Program. |
| 28 | \$36-21-221 |



- As used in this article, the following terms have the following meanings:
- 31 (1) ACADEMIC PERIOD. A semester or quarter.
- 32 (2) APPROVED POSTSECONDARY PROGRAM. Any for-credit or
 33 non-credit workforce or career training program or course of
 34 study at the undergraduate level directed toward a vocational
 35 certification, an associate degree, or a baccalaureate degree
 36 offered by a participating institution. The term includes an
 37 academic major.
- 38 (3) COMMISSION. The Alabama Commission on Higher
 39 Education, including the commission's Office of Student
 40 Assistance.
- 41 (4) ELIGIBLE DEPENDENT. An individual who, on the date 42 of applying for the scholarship provided under this article, 43 is:
- a. Not eligible for the police officer's survivors

 de ducational assistance provided under Article 5 of this

 chapter; and
- b. Either of the following:

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- 1. A natural or adopted child of a qualifying law enforcement officer, who is under 27 years of age, and who has resided in the state for at least the two preceding years; or
- 2. The current or surviving spouse of a qualifying law enforcement officer who has resided in the state for at least the two preceding years.
- (5) LAW ENFORCEMENT AGENCY. Any law enforcement department or agency that serves the state, a municipality, a county, or a postsecondary educational institution.



- 57 (6) PARTICIPATING INSTITUTION. An accredited public or 58 private postsecondary vocational school, technical school, 59 community or junior college, college, or university that 60 enters into a contract with the board to accept reimbursement 61 for a scholarship awarded to an eligible dependent.
- 62 (7) QUALIFYING LAW ENFORCEMENT OFFICER. An individual 63 who:
- a. Is or has been certified by the Alabama Peace

 Officers' Standards and Training Commission.
 - b. Is employed full-time for at least seven years by a single law enforcement agency in the state, or at least 12 continuous years on a full-time basis by more than one law enforcement agency in the state.
- 70 c. If no longer employed in law enforcement or retired,
 71 was not terminated from the most recent employment as a law
 72 enforcement officer pursuant to a disciplinary action.
- 73 (8) REQUIRED EDUCATIONAL EXPENSES. Costs charged for 74 tuition, mandatory fees, and books or electronic and digital 75 media required on a course syllabus.
- 76 \$36-21-222

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- 77 (a) The Alabama Law Enforcement Officers' Family
 78 Scholarship is established to reimburse participating
 79 institutions on behalf of eligible dependents the cost of
 80 required educational expenses for up to eight semesters or 12
 81 quarters in an approved postsecondary program.
- 82 (b) (1) The scholarship shall pay required educational 83 expenses after any other amounts from public or private 84 scholarships, grants, aid, or gifts awarded by third parties



- to the eligible dependent for the academic period have been applied.
- 87 (2) The amount for each recipient shall be capped at three thousand dollars (\$3,000) for each academic period.
 - (c) The scholarship may be granted to as many dependents of one qualifying law enforcement officer as are eligible and who comply with the requirements of this article.
- 92 (d) The scholarship shall be administered by the 93 commission.
 - (e) (1) Availability of the scholarship to eligible dependents is subject to an annual appropriation to the Alabama Law Enforcement Officers' Family Scholarship Program in the annual Education Trust Fund Appropriation Act, which shall not exceed ten million dollars (\$10,000,000).
- 99 (2) Available money for the scholarship may be 100 supplemented by private donations.
- 101 (3) Reimbursement shall be made at the end of each
 102 academic period by the commission to a participating
 103 institution by certified invoice submitted by the institution
 104 that is substantiated by the name of each student receiving
 105 the scholarship, with the amount claimed for each student.
- 106 (f) Participating institutions shall enter into a

 107 contract with the commission and agree to provide any records

 108 to the commission upon request.

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The scholarship application by an eligible dependent shall be submitted to the commission and include, but not be limited to, the following:



- 113 (1) Documentation from the participating institution 114 that the applicant has been accepted for admission and is 115 enrolled as a student.
- 116 (2) A copy of a completed Free Application for Federal
 117 Student Aid (FAFSA) submitted to the United States Department
 118 of Education, or documentation from the participating
 119 institution that the applicant has completed a FAFSA.
- 120 (3) Documentation, as determined by rules adopted by
 121 the commission, that a spouse or parent is a qualifying law
 122 enforcement officer.
- 123 (4) In the case of a dependent who is a current or
 124 surviving spouse, a certified copy of the marriage certificate
 125 to a qualifying law enforcement officer.
- 126 (5) In the case of a dependent who is a natural or
 127 adoptive child, a certified copy of the birth certificate or
 128 the decree of adoption showing the parental relationship to a
 129 qualifying law enforcement officer.
- 130 (6) A signed Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act
 131 (FERPA) release form.
- 132 \$36-21-224

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- (a) Approval for the scholarship shall be granted to an eligible dependent upon submission of the documentation required under Section 36-11-223 and shall continue for each academic period for which the scholarship may be available as provided in Section 36-11-222(a) on the following conditions:
- (1) That the recipient complies with the Standards of Satisfactory Academic Progress (SAP) as required for Title IV benefits under the federal Higher Education Act and as defined



- by the participating institution for each academic period for which the recipient is enrolled.
- 143 (2) That the recipient maintain his or her full-time 144 residency in the state.
- 145 (3) That the recipient completes the academic terms for
 146 which the scholarship is available pursuant to Section
 147 36-11-222(a) within 66 months of the approval of the
 148 application, in the absence of a formal waiver of this
 149 condition by the commission due to injury, illness, the
 150 necessity of part-time enrollment, or some other extraordinary
 151 circumstance.
- 152 (b) If the recipient's eligibility is based on spousal
 153 status, eligibility shall end if the marriage to the
 154 qualifying law enforcement officer is terminated by a decree
 155 of divorce or, in the case of a recipient who is a surviving
 156 spouse, remarriage.
- 157 (c) A recipient may maintain eligibility for the

 158 scholarship while changing his or her approved postsecondary

 159 program or transferring to another participating institution,

 160 or both, only if the change or transfer is approved by the

 161 appropriate participating institution no later than the

 162 beginning of the fifth semester or the ninth quarter for which

 163 the scholarship would be available.
- 164 \$36-21-225
- 165 (a) The responsibilities of the commission include, but
 166 may not be limited to, the following:
- 167 (1) Receive scholarship applications.
- 168 (2) Make determinations on scholarship eligibility.



- 169 (3) Waive scholarship requirements as provided in this
 170 article.
- 171 (4) Enter into and administer contracts with
- 172 participating institutions.
- 173 (5) Develop the necessary forms to administer the
- 174 program.
- 175 (6) Publicize the scholarship by written materials or
- 176 electronic means and accept donations.
- 177 (b) The commission is authorized to adopt rules to
- implement, administer, and interpret the requirements of this
- 179 article.
- 180 \$36-21-226
- The commission shall report to the Legislature, by
- January 1 of each year, all of the following:
- 183 (1) The number of applicants approved in the previous
- 184 fiscal year.
- 185 (2) The number of applicants approved as of the
- 186 reporting date of the current fiscal year.
- 187 (3) The number of recipients, by the number of
- 188 remaining academic terms for which they may be eligible for
- 189 the scholarship.
- 190 (4) The cost of the previous fiscal year's expenditures
- 191 to the program, arranged by each participating institution and
- 192 the number of recipients who are enrolled with each
- 193 participating institution.
- 194 (5) The number of recipients in the previous fiscal
- 195 year who completed an approved postsecondary program by being
- 196 awarded a certificate or a degree.



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- (a) The Alabama Law Enforcement Officers' Family
 Scholarship Fund is created in the State Treasury. All monies
 received by the commission pursuant to this article or
 otherwise from any source permitted by this article shall be
 deposited into the State Treasury to the credit of the fund.
 Amounts deposited into the fund shall be budgeted and allotted
 in accordance with Sections 41-4-80 through 41-4-96 and
 Sections 41-19-1 through 41-19-12, Code of Alabama 1975.
- 206 (b) The commission may accept additional funding for
 207 the Alabama Law Enforcement Officers' Family Scholarship
 208 Program from public and private sources, including
 209 appropriations, loans, federal gifts, grants, corporate
 210 sponsorships, and individual donations.
- 211 (c) The commission shall ensure that proceeds received 212 from Section 2 shall be the first funds expended for the 213 program each fiscal year.
- 214 Section 2. (a) Notwithstanding Sections 32-6-64, 215 32-6-67, and 32-6-68, upon application to the judge of probate 216 or license commissioner, compliance with motor vehicle 217 registration and licensing laws, payment of regular fees 218 required by law for license plates for private passenger or 219 pleasure motor vehicles or motorcycles, and payment of an 220 additional annual fee of fifty dollars (\$50), owners of motor 221 vehicles or motorcycles who are residents of Alabama shall upon request be issued a personalized blackout license plate. 222
 - (b) The additional blackout license plate fee shall be distributed in the following manner:

Pour A

- 225 (1) Two and one-half percent commission, provided by 226 Section 40-12-269(a)(1).
- 227 (2) Manufacturing costs of one dollar and fifty cents 228 (\$1.50) to the Department of Corrections.
- 229 (3) Administrative costs of one dollar (\$1) to the 230 Department of Revenue.
- 231 (4) The remainder of the additional fee shall be
 232 deposited into the Alabama Law Enforcement Officers' Family
 233 Scholarship Fund.
- (c) The Commissioner of Revenue shall prescribe a suitable plate design that includes a black background with white text.
- 237 (d) The blackout plates shall be issued, printed, and
 238 processed like other personalized plates provided for by law
 239 and shall be furnished for the licensing year commencing
 240 January 1, 2026.
- 241 (e) The Department of Revenue may adopt any rules 242 necessary to administer this section.
- Section 3. This act shall become effective on October 244 1, 2025.
