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4	SYNOPSIS:
5	Under existing federal law, the AMBER Alert
6	System sends an alert to assist in the recovery of a
7	child under 17 years of age who a law enforcement
8	agency believes has been abducted and is in imminent
9	danger of serious bodily injury or death.
10	Under existing state law, the Missing and
11	Endangered Persons Alert Act sends an alert when the
12	Alabama State Law Enforcement Agency believes an
13	individual has been abducted and has a reasonable
14	belief that the individual is at risk of bodily harm or
15	death.
16	This bill would create an Ebony Alert System to
17	send an alert to assist in the recovery of a Black
18	youth, including a young woman or girl, under certain
19	circumstances.

30 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:

31 Section 1. (a) For purposes of this section, "Ebony 32 Alert" means a notification system, activated pursuant to 33 subsection (b), designed to issue and coordinate alerts for 34 Black youth, including young women and girls, who are reported 35 missing under unexplained or suspicious circumstances.

36 (b) (1) If an individual is reported missing to a law 37 enforcement agency and that agency determines that the 38 requirements of subsection (c) are met, the law enforcement 39 agency may request the Alabama State Law Enforcement Agency to 40 activate an Ebony Alert.

41 (2) If the Alabama State Law Enforcement Agency concurs 42 that the requirements of subsection (c) have been met, it 43 shall activate an Ebony Alert within the appropriate 44 geographical area requested by the investigating law 45 enforcement agency.

46 (3) Radio, television, cable, satellite, and social
47 media systems are encouraged to cooperate with disseminating
48 the information contained in an Ebony Alert.

49 (4) Upon activation of an Ebony Alert, the Alabama
50 State Law Enforcement Agency shall assist the investigating
51 law enforcement agency by issuing a be-on-the-lookout alert,
52 an electronic flyer, or changeable message signs in compliance
53 with subdivision (5).

54 (5) Upon activation of an Ebony Alert, the Alabama
55 State Law Enforcement Agency may use a changeable message sign
56 if both of the following conditions are met:



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57 a. A law enforcement agency determines that a vehicle 58 may be involved in the incident. b. Specific identifying information about the vehicle 59 60 is available for public dissemination. 61 (c) A law enforcement agency may request that an Ebony 62 Alert be activated if that agency determines that an Ebony 63 Alert would be an effective tool in the investigation of 64 missing Black youth, including a young woman or girl, after considering the following factors: 65 (1) The missing individual is between 12 to 25 years of 66 67 age. (2) The missing individual suffers from a mental or 68 physical disability. 69 (3) The individual is missing under circumstances that 70 71 indicate any of the following: a. The missing individual's physical safety may be 72 73 endangered. 74 b. The disappearance of the missing individual may not 75 have been voluntary, including an abduction or kidnapping. 76 c. The missing individual may be subject to 77 trafficking. 78 (4) The law enforcement agency determines that the 79 individual has gone missing under unexplained or suspicious 80 circumstances. 81 (5) The law enforcement agency believes any of the 82 following: a. The individual is in danger because of age, health, 83 84 mental or physical disability, or environmental or weather



85 related conditions.

b. The individual is in the company of a potentiallydangerous individual.

c. There are other factors indicating that theindividual may be in peril.

90 (6) The investigating law enforcement agency has91 utilized available local resources.

92 (7) There is information available that, if 93 disseminated to the public, could assist in the safe recovery 94 of the missing individual.

95 Section 2. This act shall become effective on October 96 1, 2025.
