6	AN ACT
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9	Relating to Calhoun County; to amend Section
10	45-8-60.01, Code of Alabama 1975, to further provide for the
11	compensation of the coroner; and to repeal Section 45-8-60,
12	Code of Alabama 1975, relating to the compensation of the
13	coroner.
14	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:
15	Section 1. Section 45-8-60.01, Code of Alabama 1975, is
16	amended to read as follows:
17	" §45-8-60.01
18	(a) This section shall apply only to Calhoun County.
19	(b) (1) (a) (1) After May 6, 2009 May 31, 2025, the coroner
20	shall continue to receive the salary and expense allowances
21	the coroner is receiving on May 6, 2009 May 31, 2025, subject
22	to any adjustments as further provided herein.
23	(2) Commencing June 1, $\frac{2009}{2025}$, the coroner shall
24	receive an expense allowance in the amount of five thousand
25	dollars (\$5,000) twenty thousand dollars (\$20,000) per annum
26	payable in equal bi-weekly installments as provided in
27	subsection (d)(c).
28	(3) At the beginning of the next term of office of the

29	coroner Commencing January 18, 2027, the base annual salary for
30	the coroner shall be increased by five thousand dollars
31	(\$5,000) fifty-four thousand seven hundred fifty dollars
32	(\$54,750) per annum, and the all other expense allowance
33	provided for in subdivision (2) allowances or other forms of
3 4	<pre>compensation shall become void.</pre>
35	(c) (b) Commencing on May 6, 2009, there shall be no
36	more than The coroner may employ up to two compensated
37	assistant coroners. The compensation of a compensated
38	assistant coroner shall be in the form of a salary of four
39	thousand eight hundred dollars (\$4,800) six thousand one
40	hundred dollars (\$6,100) annually.
41	(d)(c) Any salary or expense allowances provided
42	pursuant to this section shall be paid bi-weekly out of the
43	general fund of the county at the same time as county
44	employees are paid.
45	$\frac{\text{(e)}}{\text{(d)}}$ The county commission $\frac{\text{may}}{\text{may}}$, in addition to the
46	expense allowances already provided by law, may provide
47	additional funds to pay the necessary expenses to provide for
48	the operation of the office of the coroner.
49	$\frac{(f)(1)a.}{(e)(1)a.}$ Except as otherwise provided in
50	paragraph b., commencing on June 1, 2009, the coroner shall
51	receive the same uniform increases in compensation, including
52	cost-of-living increases, longevity increases, merit raises,
53	and bonuses that are granted to county employees by the county
54	commission at the time of the approval of the county budget.
55	The increases shall be in the same amount or percentage, as
56	the case may be, as that amount or percentage increase



57 provided to the employees of the county.

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- 58 b. Notwithstanding any provision of this section to the 59 contrary, longevity increases for the incumbent coroner shall 60 be due and payable commencing January 6, 2010.
- c. If the implementation of any cost-of-living
 adjustment increases the salary of an incumbent coroner, the
 increase shall be paid as provided in subdivision (3). The
 base compensation for the purpose of implementing this
 subsection shall be that compensation established on June 1,
 2009, and shall remain that amount unless increased as
 provided by general or local law applicable to the coroner.
 - d. Longevity increases of the coroner shall be based on the average of longevity increases of all county employees as shown on county pay scales, as determined by the county commission. Longevity increases for the coroner shall be based on the coroner's most recent period of continuous, uninterrupted service as the coroner. The coroner shall be entitled to receive longevity increases for up to the same number of years as a county employee is entitled to receive increases. Past service as a county employee shall not be counted in determining the number of years a coroner may receive longevity increases. Compensation increases provided for in this section shall be calculated based on the compensation of the coroner being received at the time the increases become effective for county employees. The inclusion of funds in the county budget, at the time of its approval, to cover the costs for compensation increases, as provided in this section, shall be considered the granting of an increase



for whatever type of compensation increases funds are included in the county budget when it is approved.

- e. Notwithstanding any provision of this section to the contrary, the starting salary of any successor coroner shall be the salary of his or her predecessor, including all cost-of-living increases of his or her predecessor in office, but not including longevity increases, merit raises, or bonuses received by any of his or her predecessors in office.
- (2) Notwithstanding any provision of this section to the contrary, the expense allowances provided for in subsection (b) of Section 45-8-11.03 shall not be increased or become part of the salary of the coroner.
- (3) (2) Unless otherwise authorized by the law, compensation increases provided for in this section to an incumbent coroner shall be paid as an expense allowance until the beginning of the next term of office whereupon the expense allowance shall be included in the base salary for the coroner, and the expense allowance shall be void.

(g) (f) The coroner may accept reimbursement from funeral establishments for the reasonable and necessary cost to the office of the coroner for removing and transporting the body of a decedent to a funeral establishment and reimbursement for the reasonable and necessary cost of providing copies of reports and other documentation. Before the tenth of each month all amounts reimbursed to the office of the coroner during the preceding month shall be disbursed by the coroner to the county commission and deposited in a separate account for use by the coroner to pay operating



expenses of the coroner's office, to furnish supplies and 113 114 equipment necessary for the performance of the official duties 115 of the office, and to pay training expenses, including 116 expenses for travel to obtain training for the coroner, 117 assistant coroners, and other personnel of the coroner's office." 118 Section 2. Section 45-8-60, Code of Alabama 1975, 119 120 relating to the compensation of the coroner in Calhoun County, 121 is repealed. Section 3. This act shall become effective on June 1, 122 123 2025.
