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4	SYNOPSIS:
5	This bill would require each local board of
6	education and the governing body of each charter school
7	to provide each designated school employee with access
8	to students during the school day with mobile emergency
9	rapid response systems no later than October 1, 2030,
10	and provide training to employees on the systems.
11	This bill would require the State Board of
12	Education to develop a list of approved vendors and
13	adopt rules.
14	This bill would also authorize the use of
15	certain funds for purchasing and use of mobile
16	emergency rapid response systems.
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19	A BILL
20	TO BE ENTITLED
21	AN ACT
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23	Relating to public school safety; to require designated
24	school employees with access to students during the school day
25	to be equipped with mobile emergency rapid response systems
26	that meet certain requirements; to require the State Board of
27	Education to approve vendors and adopt rules; and to authorize

28 the use of various funding sources for the systems.

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29 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:

30 Section 1. (a) For the purposes of this section, the 31 following terms have the following meanings:

(1) EMPLOYEE. An employee of the State Department of
 Education, any local board of education, or any public charter
 school who has access to students during the school day. This
 term includes, but is not limited to, teachers,

36 administrators, administrative staff, custodial staff,

37 maintenance staff, cafeteria staff, nurses, counselors, media 38 specialists, coaches, and bus drivers.

39 (2) GOVERNING BODY. Each local board of education and40 the governing body of each public charter school.

(3) MOBILE EMERGENCY RAPID RESPONSE SYSTEM. A wearable device that, upon activation: (i) connects directly to the locally serving public safety answering point; and (ii) provides accurate location information to the room and floor level inside the facility and to specific areas that are part of school grounds including, but not limited to, parking lots, playgrounds, and athletic fields.

48 (4) PUBLIC SAFETY ANSWERING POINT. The same meaning as
49 Section 11-98-1, Code of Alabama 1975.

50 (b)(1) No later than October 1, 2030, each governing 51 body shall:

a. Adopt a policy designating which employees in the corresponding school system must be equipped with a mobile emergency rapid response system and when that system must be worn; and

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b. Equip each designated employee with a mobile

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57 emergency rapid response system. When activated by an 58 employee, the system must immediately connect to school system 59 or school emergency services and the local public safety 60 answering point.

61 (2) Each governing body shall provide regular training
62 to employees on the use of the mobile emergency rapid response
63 system used by the school.

64 (c) (1) The State Board of Education shall develop a 65 list of approved vendors from which each governing body may purchase approved mobile emergency rapid response systems. No 66 67 vendor may be approved if the vendor manufactures any covered equipment or services, as determined by the Federal 68 69 Communication Commission's List of Equipment and Services Covered by Section 2 of the Secure and Trusted Communications 70 71 Networks Act of 2019, Public Law 116-124.

72 (2) The State Board of Education shall adopt rules to73 administer this section.

(d) Notwithstanding any other provision of law to the contrary, each governing body may use funding from any of the following sources to comply with this section:

77 (1) The K-12 Capital Grant Program created pursuant to
78 Section 29-4-51, Code of Alabama 1975.

79 (2) The Education Trust Fund Advancement and Technology
80 Fund created pursuant to Section 29-9-4, Code of Alabama 1975.

(3) The School Security and Fire Safety Fund created
pursuant to Section 3 of Act 2024-356, 2024 Regular Session,
now appearing as Section 16-22B-3, Code of Alabama 1975.

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(4) Any other available funds or funding sources.
