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9	Relating to Baldwin County; to amend Section 45-2-240,
10	Code of Alabama 1975, to further provide for the supplemental
11	per diem paid to board of equalization members; to provide for
12	the annual increase of the supplemental payment according to
13	the Consumer Price Index; to provide retroactive effect; and
14	to make nonsubstantive, technical revisions to update the
15	existing code language to current style.
16	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:
17	Section 1. Section 45-2-240, Code of Alabama 1975, is
18	amended to read as follows:
19	" §45-2-240
20	(a) $\underline{\text{(1)}}$ In addition to the per diem paid by the state
21	pursuant to the general law, the members of the Baldwin County
22	Board of Equalization shall receive a supplement in an amount
23	sufficient to bring the per diem to one hundred fifty dollars
24	(\$150) two hundred dollars (\$200), for the years 2008 and 2009,
25	including any days the board has met in 2008 prior to April 8,
26	2008, and one hundred dollars (\$100) starting for the calendar
27	year 2025 and thereafter, as adjusted under subdivision (2).
28	This supplemental rate shall also be paid for any days the

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د ک	board meets in 2025 before the effective date of this act.
30	(2) Effective January 1, 2026, the supplemental amount
31	provided in this subsection shall be increased annually based
32	on the percentage increase in the Consumer Price Index for all
33	urban consumers for the immediately preceding calendar year as
34	published by the U.S. Department of Labor, Bureau of Labor
35	Statistics.
36	(b)(1) The board members shall be allowed mileage after
37	the annual allowance set by general law has been exhausted-,
38	which shall be paid The mileage shall be at the same rate as
39	that paid to state employees for official business.
40	(2) Any mileage paid pursuant to this section subsection
41	shall be for mileage incurred in any necessary business
42	directly related to the duties of the office, including, but
43	not limited to, the inspection of property and travel between
4 4	the member's residence and the location set for hearing
45	taxpayer protests.
46	(b) (c) The additional compensation provided for by this
47	section shall be paid on a pro rata basis by the political
48	subdivisions or funds in the county receiving ad valorem taxes
49	by computing the percentage that the amount any political
50	subdivision or fund in the county receives bears to the total
51	<pre>local ad valorem taxes</pre> Each political subdivision or fund in
52	the county receiving ad valorem taxes shall contribute to the
53	payment of the supplemental amounts provided for in this
54	section on a pro rata basis based on the percentage each
55	political subdivision or fund receives of the total local ad
56	valorem taxes collected in the county."
