4	SYNOPSIS:
5	Under existing law, rural physicians qualify for
6	an income tax credit if they meet certain
7	qualifications. Specifically, a physician must have
8	admission privileges to a small or rural hospital and
9	must practice and reside in a community that has a
10	population less than 25,000 residents and has a
11	hospital with an emergency room.
12	This bill would delete the requirement that a
13	physician must reside in a community that has a
14	hospital with an emergency room in order to qualify for
15	the tax credit.
