9	Relating to emergency medical services personnel
10	education; to amend Sections 22-18-60, 22-18-61, 22-18-62, and
11	22-18-64, Code of Alabama 1975, to further provide for the
12	Volunteer Rescue Squad Tuition Reimbursement Program by
13	authorizing the Alabama Department of Public Health, through
14	its designated regional agencies of the Office of Emergency
15	Medical Services, to provide education and receive tuition
16	reimbursement under the program; and to make nonsubstantive,
17	technical revisions to update the existing code language to
18	current style.
19	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:
20	Section 1. Sections 22-18-60, 22-18-61, 22-18-62, and
21	22-18-64, Code of Alabama 1975, are amended to read as
22	follows:
23	" §22-18-60
24	For the purposes of this article, the following terms
25	shall—have the following meanings:
26	(1) ACCS. The Alabama Community College System.
27	(2) AMBULANCE SERVICE. An ambulance service located in
28	this state which is a member of the Alabama Association of

- 30 (3) ASSOCIATIONS. The Alabama Association of Rescue
- 31 Squads, the Alabama Association of Volunteer Fire Departments,
- 32 or the Alabama Association of Ambulance Services.
- 33 (4) DESIGNATED EMS REGIONAL AGENCY. A regional agency
- 34 of the Office of Emergency Medical Services of the Alabama
- 35 Department of Public Health which is designated by the
- 36 department to offer educational courses to students.
- 37 (5) ELIGIBLE EDUCATIONAL INSTITUTION. A member school
- 38 of the ACCS, the fire college, the University of South
- 39 Alabama, or a designated regional EMS agency.

- 41 recognized levels of personnel licensed by the Alabama

- $\frac{(7)}{(9)}$ TUITION COSTS. Includes the actual cost of

- (a) The ACCS, the fire college, and the University of South AlabamaEligible educational institutions, in consultation with the associations, shall jointly develop and administer a student tuition reimbursement program for students who contract to provide two years of emergency medical services for volunteer rescue squads, volunteer fire departments, or ambulance services after becoming a licensed EMSP.
 - (b) (1) Tuition reimbursement under this article shall cover tuition costs paid by the student or the volunteer rescue squad, volunteer fire department, ambulance service, or association on behalf of the student of which the student is a member. Tuition paid by the volunteer rescue squad, volunteer fire department, ambulance service, or association shall be reimbursed directly to the volunteer rescue squad, volunteer fire department, ambulance service, or association.
- (2) Tuition reimbursement under this article shall not include any tuition costs covered by grants or other monetary awards provided to a student including, but not limited to, federal education grants and scholarships, as determined by the ACCS.
 - (3) Tuition costs shall not be reimbursed until the



student provides ACCS and the associations with documentation
that he or she has successfully completed the approved

courseprogram of instruction, proof of passing the
certification exam, production of a valid EMSP license from
the Alabama Department of Public Health, and a contractual
agreement to comply with the service requirements.

- (c) In the event that a tuition reimbursement recipient fails to meet the service requirements for any reason other than extreme hardship as defined within the joint agreement required in Section 22-18-64(b), the individual shall be deemed to have breached the underlying contract and shall be liable in the form of monetary damages to the state for the immediate repayment of the total tuition costs reimbursed, plus interest at the rate of eight percent. The associations shall notify ACCS of recipients who fail to meet the service requirements.
- (d) Beginning with the 2023-2024 fiscal year, the amount of tuition reimbursement available to students shall be divided among volunteer fire departments, rescue squads, and ambulance services based on available appropriations—in compliance with the following standards:
- (1) The ACCS shall create operational procedures to ensure that funds and volunteer service commitments are split equitably among volunteer fire departments, rescue squads, and ambulance services. Notwithstanding the foregoing, priority shall be given to volunteer fire departments, rescue squads, and nonprofit ambulance services.
 - (2) The Alabama Department of Public Health shall adopt



a rule imposing a monetary cap on the amount of tuition costs

that may be reimbursed for students who complete the program

of instruction through a designated regional EMS agency, which

shall not exceed any cap in effect on the amount of reimbursed

tuition costs for the Alabama Fire College."

Beginning October 1, 2018, the member (a) Member institutions of the ACCS, the Fire College fire college, and the University of South Alabama, and designated EMS regional agencies may enter into contracts with new students seeking to obtain certification as an EMSP.

(b) The Alabama Department of Public Health shall adopt rules setting credentialing and accreditation standards for private companies and instructors that teach courses on behalf of the designated EMS regional agencies which are equal to the standards of the other eligible education institutions."

(a) The ACCS shall annually report on the condition and accomplishments of the tuition reimbursement program to the Governor, Speaker of the House of Representatives, President Pro Tempore of the Senate, the Chair of the House Ways and Means Education Committee, the Chair of the Senate Finance and Taxation Education Committee, and the Deputy Director of the Legislative Services Agency, Fiscal Division. The report shall include the number of students participating in the program and the amount of tuition reimbursed for the reporting year.

The memberEligible educational institutions of the ACCS, the fire college, and the University of South Alabama—shall



provide this information to ACCS for inclusion in the annual report. The report shall be submitted by the fifth legislative day of each regular session of the Legislature.



- (b) The ACCS, the fire college, and the University of South Alabama shall enter into a joint agreement with the other eligible educational institutions to implement and administer the tuition reimbursement program, which shall include provisions for ensuring that operational expenses for the program in a fiscal year do not exceed 10 percent of the funding for the program in that fiscal year. The joint agreement shall provide for limiting the acceptance of applications for the program or limiting tuition reimbursements when necessary, or both.
- (c) Any monies received for the operations of the
 tuition reimbursement program, including repayments, interest,
 and penalties paid because of failure to honor service
 requirements, shall be used to fund tuition reimbursements."
