16	Relating to the Gulf of Mexico; to rename the Gulf of
17	Mexico as the "Gulf of America"; and to require all state and
18	local entities and all employees of those entities to observe
19	and implement the name change, where practicable.
20	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:
21	Section 1. For all purposes within the State of
22	Alabama, the body of water that borders the coast of Alabama,
23	previously known as the Gulf of Mexico, shall be known as the
24	"Gulf of America." Any reference to the Gulf of Mexico shall
25	be deemed to be a reference to the Gulf of America.
26	Section 2. Beginning July 1, 2025, all state and local
27	entities and their employees shall be required to do all of

SUPERIOR SERVICE

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- 29 (1) Refer to the body of water that borders the coast of Alabama as the "Gulf of America."
- 31 (2) Reflect the "Gulf of America" terminology in all 32 newly created maps, documents, educational materials,

websites, official communications, and other resources.

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- 34 (3) a. Make reasonable efforts to update all
 35 pre-existing resources owned by state and local entities,
 36 including, but not limited to, official state maps, documents,
 37 educational materials, websites, and communications under
 38 their jurisdiction to reflect the name change where
 39 practicable.
- b. The requirements of paragraph a. shall not apply if compliance would impose an undue burden, meaning significant difficulty or expense, on the state or local entity and their employees.
- Section 3. This act shall become effective on July 1, 2025.
