A BILL
TO BE ENTITLED
AN ACT

Relating to crimes and offenses; to amend Section 13A-10-41, to further provide for the crime of resisting arrest; and to provide for enhanced penalties in certain circumstances.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:

Section 1. Section 13A-10-41, Code of Alabama 1975, is amended to read as follows:

"§13A-10-41

(a) (1) A person commits the crime of resisting arrest if he or she intentionally prevents or attempts to prevent a peace officer from ~~affecting~~ effecting a lawful arrest of himself, herself, or ~~of another person~~ individual.

~~(b)~~ (2) Resisting arrest is a Class ~~B~~ A misdemeanor.

(b) A violation of subsection (a) is a Class D felony if either of the following occur during the commission of the crime:

(1) The person brandishes, as defined in Section 13A-11-7, a deadly weapon or dangerous instrument.

(2) The person's active resistance causes a physical injury to another individual.
