7	AN ACT
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9	Relating to the Alabama Commission on Higher Education
10	and the ReEngage Alabama Grant Program; to amend Sections
11	16-33D-3 and 16-33D-6, Code of Alabama 1975, to decrease the
12	minimum age of an adult learner from 25 to 22 years of age and
13	older; and to provide further for the definition of an
14	eligible student.
15	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:
16	Section 1. Sections 16-33D-3 and 16-33D-6 of the Code
17	of Alabama 1975, are amended to read as follows:
18	"§16-33D-3
19	For the purposes of this chapter, the following terms
20	have the following meanings:
21	(1) ACADEMIC TERM. A portion of an academic year, such
22	as a quarter or semester, during which an institution of
23	higher education holds classes including, but not limited to,
24	Fall, Winter, Spring, or Summer semesters.
25	(2) ADULT LEARNER. An individual who is $\frac{25}{2}$ years of
26	age or older and returning to college.
27	(3) ALABAMA RESIDENT. An individual who has been
28	classified as an in-state resident by an authorized



- 29 institution, who has established residency within this state
- 30 for at least a 12-month period prior to the beginning of the
- 31 term for which financial assistance is requested, and who is
- in this state for other than a temporary purpose.
- 33 (4) APPROVED INSTITUTION. A state-supported institution
- 34 of higher education or a private nonprofit institution of
- 35 higher education that satisfies all of the following:
- 36 a. Is accredited by the Southern Association of
- 37 Colleges and Schools Commission on Colleges, or the Council on
- 38 Occupational Education.
- 39 b. Is eligible to receive Title IV federal student aid
- 40 program funds.
- c. Maintains its primary headquarters in Alabama.
- 42 (5) AUTHORIZED INSTITUTION. An approved institution
- 43 that files a signed agreement with the commission to comply
- 44 with all rules and procedures of the ReEngage Alabama Grant
- 45 Program as provided by the commission.
- 46 (6) COMMISSION. The Alabama Commission on Higher
- 47 Education.
- 48 (7) CONTINUOUS ENROLLMENT. When an adult learner is
- 49 making academic progress toward degree completion without a
- 50 stop-out in enrollment of more than one consecutive semester
- or quarter, such as Fall/Winter to Spring, Spring to
- 52 Summer/Fall, or Summer to Fall.
- 53 (8) ELIGIBLE PROGRAM. A nonsectarian, secular
- 54 educational program that is aligned with Alabama's high demand
- workforce needs adopted by the Alabama Committee on
- 56 Credentialing and Career Pathways.



57	(9) ELIGIBLE STUDENT. An individual who completed the
58	Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA), who is in
59	pursuit of his or her first associate or first baccalaureate
60	degree, or who is in pursuit of his or her first baccalaureate
61	degree following a two-year stop-out period after receiving
62	his or her first associate degree and who did not previously
63	receive a grant award, who satisfies the criteria set out in
64	this chapter, and who is found to be eligible by rules adopted

- (10) GRANT. A financial award by the State of Alabama to defray the cost of tuition and mandatory fees to an eligible adult learner who is currently enrolled in an authorized institution.
- 70 (11) PROGRAM. The ReEngage Alabama Grant Program
 71 created by this chapter.
- 72 (12) YEAR. An academic year that shall be divided into 73 Fall, Winter, Spring, and Summer terms. The term does not mean 74 calendar or fiscal year.

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- 76 (a) The program shall be used to provide grant award 77 payments for eligible adult learners up to the maximum award 78 amount of three thousand dollars (\$3,000) for universities and 79 one thousand five hundred dollars (\$1,500) for community 80 colleges per academic semester for a full-time student. 81 Proportional awards shall be given for students taking six to 11 hours and students enrolled in less common academic terms, 82 such as quarters, Summer terms, and intersessions. 83
 - (b) Each grant shall be renewable for the number of



85 terms normally required by the institution for the course of 86 study in which the adult learner is enrolled as long as the 87 student is continuously enrolled until the student receives-an 88 his or her first associate degree or -a his or her first 89 baccalaureate degree or his or her first baccalaureate degree 90 following a two-year stop-out period after receiving his or 91 her first associate degree and did not previously receive a 92 ReEngage grant award. The commission shall grant a renewal 93 upon verification that the student remains an eliqible

95 (c) Grant award payments shall be distributed directly 96 to the approved institution on behalf of the student during 97 the applicable year.

- 98 (d) The requirements of this chapter are contingent 99 upon available funding for the program.
 - (e) The commission shall determine the necessary procedures for awarding grant award payments if the number of eligible applicants and recipients exceeds available funding.
- 103 (f) Any funds appropriated to the program shall be nonreverting.
- (g) A percentage of the grant program's appropriations
 may be expended for the operation and maintenance of the
 program.
 - (h) Each authorized institution that enrolls an adult learner who is eligible for the tuition and mandatory fees benefits provided by this program shall take necessary action to ensure that the student is aware of all other benefits that he or she may be entitled to under any other federal and state

114	order to receive the benefits provided by this program, the
115	student shall take the necessary steps to utilize all of the
116	above benefits."
117	Section 2. This act shall become effective on October
118	1, 2025.
