4	SYNOPSIS:
5	Under existing law, a person commits the crime
6	of resisting arrest if the person intentionally
7	prevents or attempts to prevent a peace officer from
8	arresting the person or another person.
9	This bill would provide that a person who
10	resists arrest shall be held in custody for 24 hours
11	before becoming eligible for release.

18	Relating to crimes and offenses; to amend Section
19	13A-10-41, Code of Alabama 1975, to provide for a mandatory
20	temporary holding period for persons who resist arrest.
21	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:
22	Section 1. Section 13A-10-41, Code of Alabama 1975, is
23	amended to read as follows:
24	"§13A-10-41
25	(a) A person commits the crime of resisting arrest if
26	he <u>or she</u> intentionally prevents or attempts to prevent a
27	peace officer from affecting a lawful arrest of himself $\underline{,}$
28	herself, or <del>of</del> another person.

29	(b) A person who violates this section shall be subject
30	to a temporary holding period and shall held in custody and
31	not released on bail or otherwise until the passage of 24
32	hours has occurred from the time of the arrest.
33	(b) (c) Resisting arrest is a Class B misdemeanor."
34	Section 2. This act shall become effective on October
35	1, 2025.
