4	SYNOPSIS:
5	Under existing law, it is unlawful for any
6	person to knowingly obtain or exert control over the
7	property of another with intent to deprive the owner of
8	his or her property.
9	This bill would provide that it is unlawful for
10	any person to knowingly obtain or exert unauthorized
11	control over any item mailed or shipped to another
12	person with intent to deprive the intended recipient of
13	his or her property.

20	Relating to crimes and offenses; to amend Section
21	13A-8-2, Code of Alabama 1975, to further provide for theft of
22	property.
23	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:
24	Section 1. Section 13A-8-2, Code of Alabama 1975, is
25	amended to read as follows:
26	"\$13A-8-2
27	(a) A person commits the crime of theft of property if
28	he or she does any of the following:

29 (1) Knowingly obtains or exerts unauthorized control 30 over the property of another, with intent to deprive the owner 31 of his or her property. + 32 (2) Knowingly obtains by deception control over the 33 property of another, with intent to deprive the owner of his 34 or her property. + 35 (3) Knowingly obtains or exerts control over property 36 in the custody of a law enforcement agency which was explicitly represented to the person by an agent of the law 37 enforcement agency as being stolen; or. 38 39 (4) Knowingly obtains or exerts unauthorized control over any donated item left on the property of a charitable 40 organization or in a drop box or trailer, or within 30 feet of 41 42 a drop box or trailer, belonging to a charitable organization. 43 (5) Knowingly obtains or exerts unauthorized control over any item mailed or shipped to another person with intent 44 45 to deprive the intended recipient of his or her property. 46 (b) The limitations period for any prosecution under 47 subdivision (2) of subsection (a) (2) does not commence or 48 begin to accrue until the discovery of the facts constituting 49 the deception, after which the prosecution shall be commenced 50 within five years." 51 Section 2. This act shall become effective on October 52 1, 2025.
