24	amended to read as follows:

  - (5) Any person individual who only occasionally dresses hair and receives no compensation therefor, or does any other act or thing mentioned in this chapter, without holding himself or herself out to the public as a provider of any practices defined in this chapter for compensation.
  - (6) Departments in retail establishments where cosmetics are demonstrated and offered for sale but where no other acts of cosmetology or barbering are performed.
  - confined solely to makeup application, and who performs makeup application on the general public for compensation in any venue, including, but not limited to, an event venue, shop, spa, or home. Makeup application includes, but is not limited to, application of makeup primer, face paint, lipstick, eyeliner, eye shadow, foundation, rouge or cheek color, mascara, strip lashes, face powder, corrective stick, and makeup remover, but does not include manual or chemical exfoliation, semipermanent lash application, lash or brow tinting, permanent makeup application, microblading, or hair removal.
