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4	SYNOPSIS:
5	Existing law provides that firefighters may be
6	paid benefits for disability or death caused by a
7	firefighter's occupational disease.
8	This bill would add Parkinson's disease to the
9	list of firefighter's occupational diseases. This bill
10	would also provide a standard for demonstrating that
11	Parkinson's disease is occupational in origin in order
12	to qualify for benefits.
13	This bill would also delete duplicative language
14	and would also make nonsubstantive, technical revisions
15	to update the existing code language to current style.

20	AN ACT
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22	Relating to firefighters; to amend Sections 11-43-144,
23	36-30-40, and 36-30-41, Code of Alabama 1975, to further
24	provide for disability and death benefits for firefighters; to
25	add Parkinson's disease to the list of firefighter's
26	occupational diseases; to provide a qualifying standard; and
27	to delete duplicative language and make nonsubstantive,
28	technical revisions to update the existing code language to



29 current style.

30 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:

31	Section 1. Sections 11-43-144, 36-30-40, and 36-30-41,
32	Code of Alabama 1975, are amended to read as follows:
33	"§11-43-144
34	(a) As used in this section the following words and
35	terms shall have the following meanings ascribed to them
36	herein unless a contrary meaning is indicated by the context:
37	(1) BENEFIT. Any monetary allowance payable by a city
38	or from a pension system established for the
39	firemenfirefighters of a city to a firefighter on account of
40	his or her disability or to his or her dependents on account
41	of his or her death, irrespective of whether the same is
42	payable under a pension law of the state or under some other
43	law of the state.
44	(2) CITY. Any municipality of the state, regardless of
45	its population.
46	(3) DISABILITY. DisabilityA condition that renders an
47	individual unable to perform the required duties as of a
48	firefighter.
49	(4) FIREFIGHTER. A personAn individual employed as a
50	firefighter by a city.
51	(5) FIREFIGHTER'S OCCUPATIONAL DISEASE. Any condition
52	or impairment of health caused by any of the following:
53	a. Hypertension.
54	b. Heart disease.
55	c. Respiratory disease.
56	d. Cancer that manifests itself in a firefighter during

57 the period in which the firefighter is in the service of the 58 city, provided if the firefighter demonstrates that he or she 59 was exposed, while in the employ of employed by the city, to a 60 known carcinogen that is reasonably linked to the disabling cancer, and in which case the cancer shall be presumed to arise 61 62 out of and in the course of the firefighter's employment τ 63 unless the city demonstrates by a preponderance of the 64 evidence that the cancer was caused by some other means.

e. AIDSHIV that manifests itself in a firefighter
during the period in which the firefighter is in the service
of <u>employed by</u> the city, <u>provided if</u> the firefighter
demonstrates that he or she was exposed to <u>AIDSHIV</u> while in
the line and scope of his or her employment with the city.

f. Hepatitis that manifests itself in a firefighter during the period in which the firefighter is in the service of the city, provided if the firefighter demonstrates that he or she was exposed to hepatitis while in the line and scope of his or her employment with the city.

75 g. Parkinson's disease that manifests itself in a 76 firefighter during the period in which the firefighter is in 77 the service of the city if the firefighter demonstrates that 78 he or she, while employed by the city, was exposed to a known 79 toxin that is associated with an increased risk of Parkinson's 80 disease, in which case the Parkinson's disease shall be presumed to arise out of and in the course of the 81 82 firefighter's employment.

(b) (1) This section shall apply to firefighters who,upon entering the service of the city as firefighters, have



successfully passed a physical examination which failed to reveal any evidence of a firefighter's occupational disease and who have completed at least three years' service as firefighters.

(2) If a physical examination was not required at the
time of entry into service, a firefighter who has completed at
least three years' continuous service as a firefighter next
preceding September 8, 1967, shall be deemed eligible for
benefits under this section.

(c)(1) If a firefighter who qualifies is eligible for 94 benefits under this section suffers disability as a result of 95 a firefighter's occupational disease, his or her disability 96 97 shall be compensable the same as any service-connected 98 disability compensated under any law that provides benefits for 99 firefighters of the city who are injured in the line of duty. If a firefighter, who qualifies for benefits under this 100 section, dies as the result of a firefighter's occupational 101 102 disease, his or her death shall be compensable to the same 103 extent as the death of a compensated the same as that of a 104 firefighter killed in the line of duty, and shall be 105 considered to have been killed in the line of duty for 106 purposes of Sections 36-30-1 to 36-30-7, inclusive pursuant to 107 Article 1 of Chapter 30 of Title 36.

108 (2) Notwithstanding subdivision (1), a firefighter who 109 dies of cancer, as provided in paragraph (a) (5)d., within 10 110 years of the firefighter's last date of employment shall be 111 considered to have been killed in the line of duty for 112 purposes of Sections 36-30-1 to 36-30-7, inclusiveArticle 1 of



113 Chapter 30 of Title 36. (d) In the case of cancer, heart disease, hypertension, 114 115 and respiratory disease, thea firefighter's occupational 116 disease as defined in this section, the city must prove by a 117 preponderance of the evidence that the condition was caused by 118 some means other than the occupation to disqualify the 119 firefighter from benefits." 120 "\$36-30-40 As used in this article, the following terms shall have 121 122 the following meanings: 123 (1) BENEFIT. or she, while in the employ of employed by the state, was exposed to a known carcinogen which that is reasonably linked to the disabling cancer, and in which case the cancer shall be presumed to arise out of and in the course of the firefighter's employment unless the state demonstrates by a preponderance of the evidence that the cancer was caused by some other means.

e. HIV which<u>that</u> manifests itself in a firefighter during the period in which the firefighter is <u>in the service</u> <u>ofemployed by</u> the state, <u>provided if</u> the firefighter demonstrates <u>by sufficient evidence</u> that he or she was exposed to HIV while in the line and scope of his or her employment with the state.

154 f. Hepatitis which that manifests itself in a 155 firefighter during the period in which the firefighter is in 156 the service of the state, provided if the firefighter 157 demonstrates that he or she was exposed to hepatitis while in 158 the line and scope of his or her employment with the state.

159 g. Parkinson's disease that manifests itself in a 160 firefighter during the period in which the firefighter is in 161 the service of the state if the firefighter demonstrates that 162 he or she, while employed by the state, was exposed to a known 163 toxin that is associated with an increased risk of Parkinson's 164 disease, in which case the Parkinson's disease shall be 165 presumed to arise out of and in the course of the 166 firefighter's employment." 168 (a) This article shall apply to firefighters who, upon



169 entering the service of the state as firefighters, have 170 successfully passed a physical examination which failed to 171 reveal any evidence of a firefighter's occupational disease 172 and who have completed at least three years' service as 173 firefighters. If a physical examination was not required at 174 the time of entry into service, a firefighter who completes an 175 exam by January 1, 2013, shall be deemed eligible for benefits 176 under this section.

177 (b) If a firefighter who qualifies is eligible for benefits under Chapter 29A, or any other law, suffers 178 179 disability as a result of a firefighter's occupational disease, his or her disability shall be compensable the same 180 181 as any service-connected disability compensated under any law 182 which that provides benefits for firefighters of the state who 183 are injured in the line of duty. If a firefighter who qualifies for benefits under this section dies as the result 184 185 of a firefighter's occupational disease, his or her death 186 shall be compensable to the same extent as the death of a firefighter killed in the line of duty, and the firefighter 187 188 shall be considered to have compensated as if the firefighter 189 had been killed in the line of duty for purposes of Sections 36-30-1 to 36-30-7, inclusivepursuant to Article 1. 190

(c) In the case of an occupational disease as defined in this article, the state must prove by a preponderance of the evidence that the condition was caused by some means other than the occupation to disqualify the firefighter from benefits."

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Section 2. This act shall become effective on October
