5	Under existing law, only an ambulance licensed
6	by the State Committee of Public Health may transport a
7	patient who requires a stretcher. An unlicensed medical
8	transport service may not transport a patient who
9	requires a stretcher.
10	This bill would authorize a medical transport
11	service to transport a patient who requires a
12	stretcher, gurney, or cot to medical care services in
13	non emergency medical circumstances.
14	This bill would also provide that the State
15	Committee of Public Health may adopt rules to enforce

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AN ACT

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Relating to medical transport services; to authorize a medical transport vehicle, other than an ambulance, to transfer a patient on a stretcher, gurney, or cot in certain non emergency medical circumstances; and to authorize the State Committee of Public Health to adopt rules.

28 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:

SUP OF ALARMA

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- Section 1. (a) The State Committee of Public Health
 shall not prohibit a non emergency medical transport service
 from transporting a patient on a stretcher, gurney, or cot,
 provided that each of the following apply:
- 33 (1) The transport vehicle is designed and equipped to 34 hold a stretcher, gurney, or cot.

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- (2) The patient is being transported to or from a medical care facility under non emergency circumstances, including transportation to and from medical appointments. For the purposes of this section, a non emergency circumstance exists when the health and life of a patient is not at serious risk without immediate medical treatment, such as uncontrolled bleeding, a heart attack, an automobile accident, or other serious trauma. The State Committee of Public Health may adopt rules further defining a non emergency circumstance.
- (b) The State Committee of Public Health may adopt
 rules governing the operation and conduct of non emergency
 medical transport services and vehicles pursuant to this
 section.
- Section 2. This act shall become effective on October 1, 2025.
