4	SYNOPSIS:
5	Existing law requires each pupil who is
6	otherwise entitled to admittance to kindergarten or
7	first grade, or any other entrance into an Alabama
8	public or private school, to present a certificate of
9	immunization or testing, commonly known as a Blue Card,
10	for the prevention of those communicable diseases
11	designated by the State Health Officer, unless exempted
12	by religious or medical reasons.
13	This bill would allow dependents of active duty
14	military personnel to substitute military medical
15	records as evidence of age-appropriate immunization and
16	testing instead of the Blue Card for presentation to a
17	public or private school authority.

30 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:

31 Section 1. Section 16-30-4, Code of Alabama 1975, is 32 amended to read as follows:

33 "\$16-30-4

34 (a) (1) The boards of education and the governing 35 authority of each private school shall require each pupil who 36 is otherwise entitled to admittance to kindergarten or first grade, whichever is applicable, or any other entrance into an 37 Alabama public or private school, to present a certification 38 39 of immunization or testing, commonly known as a Blue Card, for the prevention of those communicable diseases designated by 40 the State Health Officer, except as provided in Section 41 42 16-30-3. Provided, however, that any student presently 43 enrolled in a school in this state, not having been immunized upon initial entrance to school, is hereby required to present 44 a certification of immunization as described in this section 45 46 upon commencement of the next school year.

47 (2) Dependents of active duty military personnel may
48 satisfy this requirement by the presentation of copies of

49 military medical records reflecting age-appropriate

50 immunizations and testing.

51 (b) Section 16-30-1 and this section shall apply only 52 to kindergarten through 12th grade and not to the institutions 53 of higher learning."

54 Section 2. This act shall become effective on July 1, 55 2025.
