10	cloning; and to provide criminal penalties.
11	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:
12	Section 1. For the purposes of this act, the following
13	terms have the following meanings:
14	(1) EMBRYO. An organism of the species homo sapiens
15	from the single cell stage to eight weeks of development. This
16	term includes an embryo that is derived by fertilization,
17	parthenogenesis, human cloning, or any other means from one or
18	more human gametes or human diploid cells.
19	(2) FETUS. An organism of the species homo sapien from
20	eight weeks of development until complete expulsion or
21	extraction from a woman's body, removal from an artificial
22	womb, or other similar environment designed to nurture the
23	development of the organism.
24	(3) HUMAN CLONING. a. The process of human asexual
25	reproduction, accomplished by:
26	1. Introducing the genetic material from one or more
27	human somatic cells into a fertilized or unfertilized oocyte
28	whose nuclear material has been removed or inactivated so as

- 29 to produce a living organism, at any stage of development,
- 30 that is genetically virtually identical to an existing or
- 31 previously existing human organism;
- 32 2. Artificially subdividing a human embryo at any time
- from the two-cell stage onward resulting in more than one
- 34 human organism;
- 3. Introducing pluripotent stem cells from any source
- 36 into a human embryo or artificially manufactured human embryo
- 37 or trophoblast under conditions where the introduced cells
- 38 generate all or most of the body tissues of the
- 39 fully-developed living organism; or
- 4. Genetically modifying human skin cells or organisms
- 41 into viable oocyte or sperm with genetic material from the
- same source as the oocyte or sperm used in reproduction to
- 43 create an embryo.
- b. This term does not apply to in vitro fertilization,
- 45 the administration of fertility-enhancing drugs, or other
- 46 procedures used to assist a woman in becoming or remaining
- 47 pregnant, unless performed with specific intent to result in
- 48 the gestation or birth of a child genetically identical to
- another embryo, fetus, or human being, living or dead.
- 50 (4) OOCYTE. The human female germ cell, the egg.
- 51 (5) SOMATIC CELL. A diploid cell, having a complete set
- 52 of chromosomes, obtained or derived from a living or deceased
- human body at any stage of development.
- Section 2. (a) A person commits the crime of human
- cloning if the person intentionally does any of the following:
- (1) Performs or attempts to perform human cloning.

- (2) Participates in an attempt to perform human 57 58 cloning. 59 (3) Ships, transfers, or receives for any purpose an 60 embryo produced by human cloning. 61 (4) Ships, transfers, or receives, in whole or in part, 62 any oocyte, embryo, fetus, or human somatic cell for the 63 purpose of human cloning. 64 (b) A violation of this section is a Class C felony. 65 Section 3. This act does not restrict areas of scientific research not specifically prohibited by this act, 66 67 including research into the use of nuclear transfer or other cloning techniques to produce molecules, deoxyribonucleic 68 69 acid, cells other than embryos, tissues, organs, plants, or
- Section 4. This act shall become effective on October 1, 2025.
