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4	SYNOPSIS:
5	Under existing law, bread, flour, and cornmeal
6	are required to be enriched with certain vitamins and
7	other ingredients before being sold for human
8	consumption in this state.
9	This bill would require corn masa and products
10	containing corn masa be enriched with folic acid before
11	being sold for human consumption in this state.
12	This bill would also make nonsubstantive,
13	technical revisions to update the existing code
14	language to current style.
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17	A BILL
18	TO BE ENTITLED
19	AN ACT
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21	Relating to food enrichment; to amend Section 20-1-71,
22	Code of Alabama 1975, to define the terms "corn masa" and
23	"corn masa product"; to make nonsubstantive, technical
24	revisions to update the existing code language to current
25	style; and to add Section 20-1-79 to the Code of Alabama 1975,
26	to require corn masa and corn masa products be enriched with
27	certain ingredients prior to being sold for human consumption.
28	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:

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29	Section 1. Section 20-1-71, Code of Alabama 1975, is
30	amended to read as follows:
31	"\$20-1-71
32	When used in this article, the following words and
33	phrases terms shall have the following meanings, respectively,
34	unless the context clearly indicates otherwise:
35	(1)(3) BREAD. Such term includes and shall be limited
36	to bread Bread and, rolls (or buns), or buns of every kind and
37	description made wholly or partly from wheat flour which
38	conforms to the definition and standard of identity of bread
39	set out in 21 Code of Federal Regulations, Part 17 C.F.R. Part
40	136. Such term excludes The term does not include bread
41	containing no wheat flour or breads made from 100 percent
42	whole wheat flour , but . The term includes breads made from
43	mixtures of white flour and whole wheat flour, the so-called
44	known as brown breads.
45	(4) CORN MASA. A dry flour-type product made from corn
46	that has been treated with slaked lime or otherwise undergoes
47	a process known as nixtamalization.
48	(5) CORN MASA PRODUCT. Any food product containing corn
49	masa.
50	(2) (8) FLOUR. Such term includes and shall be limited
51	to the foods defined as:
52	a. Flour, white flour, wheat flour, and plain flour ; .
53	b. Bromated flour ; .
54	c. Self-rising flour, self-rising white flour, and
55	self-rising wheat flour ; and .
56	d. Phosphated flour, phosphated white flour, and

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57 phosphated wheat flour in the definitions and standards of identity set out in 21 Code of Federal Regulations, Part 15 58 59 C.F.R. Part 137. Such term also The term includes all mixtures 60 of such flours with whole wheat or high-extraction flours, but excludes. The term does not include 100 percent whole wheat 61 62 flour and specially packaged cake and pancake flour. 63 (3) (6) CORNMEAL. All meal for human consumption made 64 from corn, either white or yellow, whole cornmeal, bolted 65 cornmeal, and degerminated cornmeal as defined in definitions and standards of identity set out in 21-Code of Federal 66 67 Regulations, Part 15 C.F.R. Part 137. (4) (9) GRITS. Grits, pearl grits, and degerminated 68 grits made from corn by grinding or cracking as defined in the 69 70 standards of identity set out in 21 Code of Federal 71 Regulations, Part 15 C.F.R. Part 137. (5) (7) ENRICHMENT. As applied to bread, flour, meal, or 72 73 grits, such term means the addition thereto of vitamins and 74 other ingredients of the nature required by this article and 75 "enriched bread," "enriched flour," "enriched whole cornmeal," 76 "enriched bolted meal," "enriched degerminated meal," or 77 "enriched grits" means the appropriate food product, according to the federal standards of identity, that has been enriched 78 79 to conform to the requirements of this article. 80 (6) (10) PERSON. An individual, -a corporation, -a partnership, <u>an</u> association, <u>a</u> joint stock company, <u>a</u> trust, 81 82 or any unincorporated organization. (7) (1) APPROPRIATE FEDERAL AGENCY. The federal agency 83 84 or department or administrative federal officer charged with Page 3

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85 the enforcement and administration of the federal Food, Drug 86 and Cosmetic Act. 87 (8) (2) BOARD. The Alabama State Board of Agriculture 88 and Industries." 89 \$20-1-79 90 Section 2. Section 20-1-79 is added to the Code of 91 Alabama 1975, to read as follows: 92 (a) No person shall manufacture, mix, compound, sell, 93 trade, or offer for sale or trade for human consumption any corn masa or corn masa product in this state unless the 94 95 following ingredients are contained in each pound thereof: (1) For corn masa, not less then 0.7 milligrams of 96 97 folic acid. (2) For corn masa products, not less than 0.4 98 99 milligrams of folic acid. (b) This section shall not apply to either of the 100 101 following: 102 (1) Corn masa or corn masa products made by or 103 supplied to a cottage food production operation. 104 (2) Corn masa or corn masa products offered for sale by 105 a grocery store. 106 Section 3. This act shall become effective on June 1, 107 2026.
