#### SYNOPSIS:

This bill would establish a system under the Department of Conservation and Natural Resources through the Mobile and Baldwin County Emergency Management Agencies to warn individuals of a shark attack or unusual shark activity in waters near a beach or shoreline by providing for alerts to be sent to mobile cellular devices in localized areas and to first responders on duty.

This bill would further provide for the assistance of other state departments and agencies and local first responder organizations in the development and operation of the shark alert system.

A BILL

TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT

Relating to public safety; to establish a shark alert system for Baldwin and Mobile Counties; to provide for the development, implementation, and operation of the alert system by the Department of Conservation and Natural Resources with assistance of other agencies of the state and political subdivisions.



- 29 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:
- 30 Section 1. (a) This section shall be known and may be
- 31 cited as the LuLu Gribbin Shark Alert System Act.
- 32 (b) For the purposes of this section, the following
- 33 terms have the following meanings:
- 34 (1) ALERT SYSTEM. The shark alert system.
- 35 (2) BEACHES AND COASTAL AREAS. Beaches and shorelines
- 36 that face the Gulf of America or Pelican Bay.
- 37 (3) COMMISSIONER. The Commissioner of Conservation and
- 38 Natural Resources.
- 39 (4) DEPARTMENT. The Department of Conservation and
- 40 Natural Resources.
- 41 (5) FIRST RESPONDER. Lifeguards, rescue squad members,
- 42 emergency medical service providers, public safety
- 43 telecommunicators, municipal, county, and state law
- 44 enforcement officers, including enforcement officers of the
- 45 department, and any other emergency management provider who
- 46 responds to an emergency situation.
- 47 (6) WIRELESS EMERGENCY ALERT. A text message, short
- 48 message service, or other data application broadcast from a
- 49 cell tower to all compatible mobile wireless or phone devices
- that are turned on in a geographic area.
- 51 (c) (1) The shark alert system is established to serve
- 52 the beaches and coastal areas in Baldwin and Mobile Counties.
- 53 (2) The Department of Conservation and Natural
- 54 Resources shall adopt rules to implement and administer this
- 55 section, including establishing operating protocols for
- 56 activating the alert system.



- 57 (3) In the development and implementation of the alert 58 system, the commissioner shall receive upon request the full 59 cooperation, including assistance, expertise, and information, 60 of other departments and agencies of this state or political subdivisions thereof, including the Alabama Emergency 61 Management Agency, local emergency management organizations, 62 63 the Alabama State Law Enforcement Agency, the Office of 64 Emergency Medical Services of the Alabama Department of Public 65 Health, the Alabama Gulf Emergency Medical Services System, and all first responder organizations that employ or use 66 67 emergency medical services personnel licensed under Chapter 18, Title 22, Code of Alabama 1975, the Offices of Sheriff of 68 69 Baldwin and Mobile Counties, and the municipalities with 70 jurisdiction over beaches and coastal areas, including the 71 police and other municipal departments that manage public beaches, parks, and piers. 72
  - (4) The commissioner may enter into agreements with any department or agency of this state or any political subdivision thereof, including those listed in subdivision (3), to provide necessary resources and support for the implementation and operation of the alert system.
- 78 (d) The alert system shall be activated upon the occurrence of any the following events:

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- 80 (1) When the department receives a confirmed report of an unprovoked shark attacking an individual.
- 82 (2) When the department receives a credible report with 83 sufficient descriptive information, as defined by department 84 rule, that shark activity may pose an imminent danger to



- 85 individuals at or near the beaches and coastal areas.
- 86 (3) Any other criteria adopted by rule of the
- department when the department determines that an alert would
- 88 be in the best interest of the public and to avoid false
- 89 alarm.
- 90 (e) No private cause of action may be maintained for
- 91 failure to activate the shark alert system.
- 92 Section 2. This act shall become effective on October
- 93 1, 2025.
