5	Under existing law, the Underground Damage
6	Prevention Program exists to administer the One-Call
7	Notification System to safeguard against injury and
8	loss of life due to excavation or demolition and to
9	protect underground facilities from costly damage and
L 0	the interruption of utility or other services to the
1	general public.
12	The program is subject to a statutory sunset
L3	clause which takes effect on January 1, 2027.
L 4	This bill would extend the statutory sunset

22	Relating to the Underground Damage Prevention Program;
23	to amend Section 37-15-5, Code of Alabama 1975, to extend the
24	existing statutory sunset clause related to the program.
25	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:
26	Section 1. Section 37-15-5, Code of Alabama 1975, is
27	amended to read as follows:

29 (a) Until January 1, 20272035: 30 (1) Operators who have underground facilities within this state shall participate in and utilize the services of 31 32 the One-Call Notification System. (2) Operators that are members of the One-Call 33 Notification System on January 1, 2020, must remain members. 34 (3) Operators with more than 25,000 customers or 500 35 36 miles of facilities, that are not members, must join the One-Call Notification System by January 1, 2021. 37 (4) Operators that do not meet the thresholds described 38 in subdivision (2) or (3), must join the One-Call Notification 39 System by January 1, 2022. 40 41 (5) (2) Operators of electrical underground facilities that join the One-Call Notification System under the 42 43 requirements of subdivision (3) or (4) having less than five percent underground trench miles compared to the total miles 44 of line, are not subject to the membership costs until their 45 46 underground trench miles exceed the trench mile exemption. 47 These operators shall be required to report annually to the One-Call Notification System their percentage of underground 48 49 trench miles by the end of each calendar year. 50 (6) (3) If an operator of an underground facility fails 51 to become a member of the One-Call Notification System, as 52 required by this chapter, and that failure is a cause of 53 damage to that underground facility caused by a person who has 54 complied with this chapter and has exercised reasonable care in the performance of the excavations that has caused damage 55

to the underground facility, the operator has no right of

recovery against the person for the damage to that underground facility.

- 59 (b) Between April 18, 1994, and January 1, 1995, or any 60 time thereafter, any Any non-profit corporation, public corporation, or governmental entity desiring to become 61 the One-Call Notification System shall apply to the Alabama 62 63 Public Service Commission for a certificate of public convenience and necessity, verifying under oath that the 64 applicant meets the requirements of this chapter. After a 65 public hearing on the application, if the Alabama Public 66 67 Service Commission deems that the applicant meets the requirements of this chapter, and if it is found that the 68 applicant is fit, willing, and able to properly perform the 69 70 services proposed and that the proposed service is or will be 71 required by the present or future public convenience or necessity, then in such event the Alabama Public Service 72 73 Commission may issue a certificate of public convenience and 74 necessity authorizing the applicant to commence its operation 75 as the One-Call Notification System. The Alabama Public 76 Service Commission shall revoke a certificate if the 77 non-profit corporation, public corporation, or 78 governmental entity ceases to meet the requirements as set 79 forth in this chapter. The One-Call Notification System must 80 provide a report of operations and financial review or audit 81 to the Public Service Commission annually.
 - (c) Subject to subsections (a) and (b), there shall be a statewide One-Call Notification System in accordance with this chapter to provide notice of all excavation or demolition

85 near underground facilities.

- (d) The One-Call Notification System shall be incorporated or operated as a non-profit corporation and governed by a board of directors representing its membership in accordance with the One-Call Notification System bylaws.
 - (e) Operators of underground natural gas or hazardous liquid pipeline facilities or the One-Call Notification System acting on their behalf shall develop and implement a public awareness and damage prevention program to educate the general public, excavators, and operators about the availability and use of the One-Call Notification System as required in applicable federal regulations and the requirements of this chapter.
- 99 (f) The person giving notice of intent to excavate or
 100 demolish shall be furnished an individual reference file
 101 number for each notification and upon request shall be
 102 furnished the names of the operators to whom the notification
 103 will be transmitted.
 - (g) An adequate record of notifications shall be maintained by the underground facility operator or the One-Call Notification System in order to document timely compliance with this chapter. These records shall be retained for a period of not less than three years and shall be made available at a reasonable cost upon proper and adequate advance request.
- 111 (h) The services of the One-Call Notification System
 112 should be provided on working days in accordance with the



- 113 established working day hours.
- 114 (i) The One-Call Notification System should voice
- 115 record the notification telephone calls and after hours calls
- should at least reach a voice recording which explains
- emergency procedures.
- 118 (j) All members of the One-Call Notification System
- shall provide the One-Call Notification System with the
- 120 following information:
- 121 (1) The notification area data in a format as required
- 122 by the current database system utilized by the One-Call
- 123 Notification System for the locations in which members have
- 124 underground facilities or for other reasons wish to receive
- 125 notifications of proposed excavations, demolitions, or
- 126 blasting. This information shall be updated at least once a
- 127 year.
- 128 (2) The name, address, and telephone number of a person
- 129 to receive emergency notifications.
- 130 (k) The One-Call Notification System shall promptly
- 131 transmit the information received from the excavator, as set
- forth in Section 37-15-4, to its appropriate member operators.
- 133 (1) All members of the One-Call Notification System who
- have changes, additions, or new installations of buried
- facilities within the boundaries of the State of Alabama shall
- 136 notify the One-Call Notification System of changes in the
- information required in subdivision (1) of subsection (j) (1),
- 138 within 30 days of the completion of such change, addition, or
- 139 new installation."
- Section 2. This act shall become effective on January
