This bill makes supplemental appropriations for the fiscal year ending September 30, 2025, from the Opioid Treatment and Abatement Fund to the entities and for the purposes specified herein in the amount of \$41,059,071.

AN ACT

To make supplemental appropriations for the fiscal year ending September 30, 2025, from the Opioid Treatment and Abatement Fund to the entities and for the purposes herein in the amount of \$41,059,071.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:

Section 1. There is hereby appropriated from the Opioid Treatment and Abatement Fund the sum of \$41,059,071 for the fiscal year ending September 30, 2025, to the entities and for the purposes specified herein:

(1) To the Department of Corrections for curriculum, peer support, addiction counseling, and medication for MAT, \$900,000.

(2) To the Board of Pardons and Paroles for passenger

29 vans to expand opioid treatment programs, \$120,000.

30 (3) To the Department of Mental Health, \$27,860,000. Of
31 this amount \$2,000,000 shall be used for Medicaid State Match;
32 \$1,000,000 shall be used for residential detox; \$1,000,000
33 shall be used to purchase Naloxone; \$3,500,000 shall be used
34 for the 988 Crisis Line; \$8,930,000 shall be used for
35 prevention, treatment, and recovery grants; \$5,000,000 shall
36 be used for co-occurring civil commitment beds; \$1,300,000
37 shall be used for a statewide marketing campaign; \$130,000
38 shall be used for medical medicine education by the Alabama
39 Society of Addiction Medicine; \$5,000,000 shall be used to
40 establish a dedicated opioid treatment center using the
41 Therapeutic Community Treatment Model through an RFP.

42 (4) To Auburn University for the expansion of the
43 School of Pharmacy, K-12 Education Program and Pharmacy
44 Training related to substance abuse, \$1,000,000.

45 (5) To the University of Alabama at Birmingham for
46 residencies in psychiatry related to the study and treatment
47 of substance abuse, \$1,000,000. Of this amount, \$500,000 shall
48 be used for a residency in Montgomery and \$500,000 shall be
49 used for a residency in Huntsville.

50 (6) To the USA Health University of South Alabama for
51 training of primary care providers in screening for opioid
52 dependency, \$1,000,000.

53 (7) To the Alabama Department of Public Health to
54 provide rapid response to overdose outbreaks related to opioid
55 use, \$500,000.

56 (8) To the Administrative Office of Courts for Mental

57 Health, Veterans and Drug Courts Grant Program, \$3,000,000.

58 (9) To the Department of Veterans Affairs for
59 continuation and sustainability of the Veterans Pilot Program,
60 \$1,500,000.

61 (10) To the Department of Human Resources for a grant
62 program for at-risk youth opioid prevention and education,
63 \$500,000.

64 (11) To the Office of Prosecution Services for opioid
65 prevention programs, inmate opioid treatment costs, Naloxone,
66 and opioid management in cooperation with the Alabama Sheriffs
67 Association, \$2,600,000.

68 (12) To the Department of Forensic Sciences for
69 fentanyl testing technology, \$800,000.

70 (13) To the Department of Senior Services for the
71 Kinship Caregiver Pilot Program, \$279,071.

72 Section 2. All funds appropriated in this act not
73 expended in the fiscal year ending September 30, 2025, shall
74 not revert, but shall be carried forward for the purpose
75 appropriated.

76 Section 3. This act shall become effective June 1,
77 2025.
