17	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:
18	Section 1. Section 22-18-4, Code of Alabama 1975, is
19	amended to read as follows:
20	<b>"</b> §22-18-4
21	(a) In addition to all other fees <del>now payable, the</del>
22	Board of Healthdepartment shall establish, by rule, a fee for
23	EMSP and air or ground provider service licenses. Each license
24	issued to an EMSP shall be valid for a period of 24 calendar
25	months. Each license issued to a provider service shall be
26	valid for a period not to exceed 12 calendar months. The same
27	fee shall be charged for renewal of a license. No additional
28	fee shall be collected when an EMSP becomes eligible for



29 reclassification of his or her license to a higher level.

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- (b) All fees collected under this chapter shall be retained in a separate fund by the Board of Healthdepartment for the purpose of enforcing this chapter, and shall be disbursed as other funds of the state are disbursed; provided, that no fee or permit charge authorized under this chapter shall be charged or collected for the issuing of a permit to a volunteer rescue squad, as defined in Section 32-11-1, for providing ambulance service on a gratuitous basis, or any member thereof who volunteers his or her service, unless licensure is requested by the squad, company, or individual, whereupon, a fee willshall be charged.
- (c) Any person desiring EMSP licensure shall complete an approved EMSP course as defined by rules of the Board of Healthdepartment, successfully pass the appropriate level licensure examination as determined by the Board of Health department, and submit an application to the board department. An approved EMSP course for any level shall be a course conforming to the curriculum for that level as approved by the United States Department of Transportation, or approved by any other federal agency as, in the future, may takehave jurisdiction over EMSP training curriculum development. A curriculum may be required to be supplemented with additional modules: (i) if the modules are optional modules approved by the United States Department of Transportation, or its successor as specified above, and (ii) the optional modules are prescribed, by rule, by the board department pursuant to the Alabama Administrative



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- 58 (d) (1) The department shall accept, upon satisfactory presentation by the applicant, education, training, and 59 60 experience completed while a member of the Armed Forces or Reserves of the United States or the National Guard, Military 61 62 Reserves, or Naval Militia of any state, and proof of successful passage of the National Registry of Emergency 63 64 Medical Technicians examination as credit toward the 65 qualifications for EMSP licensure.
- 66 (2) The department shall adopt rules to implement this subsection.

(d) (e) No air or ground ambulance shall be operated for ambulance purposes, and no individual shall fly, drive, operate, attend, or permit the ambulance to be operated for the purpose of transporting a patient from any point within the State of Alabama to any other point within the State of Alabama unless the ambulance is duly licensed by the Board of Healthdepartment. The Board of Healthdepartment may prescribe exceptions to this requirement consistent with the interests of public health. Any ground ambulance shall at all times be driven by a person holding a valid driver's driver license and who has passed the Emergency Vehicle Operator Course approved by the Board of Healthdepartment, the Apparatus Operator's Course taught by the Alabama Fire College, or the Emergency Vehicle Driver Course taught by the Alabama Fire College." Section 2. This act shall become effective on October 1, 2025.
