#### SYNOPSIS:

Under existing law, many examining and licensing boards that regulate professions in the State of Alabama accept experience, training, and education gained by an individual during military service as credit toward occupational or professional qualification requirements.

This bill would extend this allowance to individuals seeking an emergency medical services personnel license from the Alabama Department of Public Health.

This bill would delete duplicative language and also make nonsubstantive, technical revisions to update the existing code language to current style.

- 32 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:
- 33 Section 1. Section 22-18-4, Code of Alabama 1975, is
- 34 amended to read as follows:
- 35 **"**\$22-18-4
- Board of Healthdepartment shall establish, by rule, a fee for EMSP and air or ground provider service licenses. Each license

(a) In addition to all other fees now payable, the

- issued to an EMSP shall be valid for a period of 24 calendar
- 40 months. Each license issued to a provider service shall be
- $^{41}$  valid for a period not to exceed 12 calendar months. The same
- fee shall be charged for renewal of a license. No additional
