BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA: Section 1. The following amendment to the Constitution

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA: Section 1. The following amendment to the Constitution of Alabama of 2022, is proposed:



Constitution of Alabama of 2022, in election precincts one 29 30 through seven of Baldwin County, as the precincts existed on 31 July 27, 1965, shall be continued, as provided in subsection 32 (b), upon approval of this amendment and by simultaneous 33 approval of a majority of the qualified electors in election precincts 1, 2, 4, 5, 6, 7, 11, 12, 13, 14, 15, 16, 17, 18, 34 35 19, 21, 26, 27, and 45 of Baldwin County as the precincts 36 existed on January 1, 2025, voting thereon in the 37 constitutional election ratifying this proposed amendment.

(b) Upon ratification, the Baldwin County Commission 38 39 shall continue to levy and cause to be collected annually, beginning October 1, 2027, for a period of 20 years, in 40 addition to any taxes now authorized or that may be hereafter 41 42 authorized by the constitution and laws of this state, a 43 special district tax of two mills on each one dollar (\$1) assessed valuation of taxable property in election precincts 44 45 1, 2, 4, 5, 6, 7, 11, 12, 13, 14, 15, 16, 17, 18, 19, 21, 26, 46 27, and 45 of Baldwin County, Alabama as the precincts existed 47 on January 1, 2025, to be used exclusively for public hospital 48 purposes, as defined in Section 215.03, within these election 49 precincts.

(c) The Baldwin County Commission, in anticipation of tax proceeds, may issue, without further election, interest bearing tax anticipation bonds, warrants, or certificates of indebtedness of the county payable solely from and secured by a pledge of a sufficient amount of the annual proceeds from the tax received by the county.

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(d) The Baldwin County Commission may designate, as the



57 agency of the county, any public corporation heretofore or 58 hereafter organized for hospital purposes in the county, to 59 construct, acquire, equip, operate, and maintain public 60 hospital facilities for election precincts 1, 2, 4, 5, 6, 7, 11, 12, 13, 14, 15, 16, 17, 18, 19, 21, 26, 27, and 45 of 61 Baldwin County, Alabama, as the precincts existed on January 62 63 1, 2025. When a public corporation has been designated, the 64 proceeds of the tax thereafter collected shall be paid to it 65 and shall be used for any one or more public hospital purpose; provided, that payments of the proceeds of the tax to the 66 67 public corporation shall be made only to the extent as will not result in the impairment of the obligation of any contract 68 made with respect to the tax. The public corporation may 69 70 anticipate the proceeds from the tax by issuing, for any one 71 or more of the purposes for which the tax has been voted, the bonds, warrants, or certificates of indebtedness of the 72 73 corporation, and may pledge for the payment of the principal 74 thereof and interest thereon a sufficient amount of the annual 75 proceeds from the tax.

76 (e) (1) No securities issued or contracts made by 77 Baldwin County under the authority of this amendment, which 78 are payable solely out of the proceeds of the tax, and no 79 securities issued or contracts made by the corporation, 80 whether or not issued or made under the authority of this 81 amendment, shall be contrued to be bonds of Baldwin County or of a political subdivision of the county within the meaning of 82 Section 222, or construed to create or constitute an 83 84 indebtedness of the county within the meaning of Section 224.



85 (2) The securities shall be construed to be negotiable
86 instruments notwithstanding the fact that the bonds may be
87 payable solely from a limited source.

(f) All pledges of the tax and all contracts made with respect to the tax pursuant to this amendment shall take precedence in the order in which the pledges are made and shall create a charge on the proceeds of the tax prior to the expenses of operating and maintaining any public hospital facilities.

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(g) This amendment shall be self-executing.

95 Upon ratification of this constitutional amendment, the Code Commissioner shall number and place this amendment as 96 97 appropriate in the constitution omitting this instructional 98 paragraph and may make the following nonsubstantive revisions: 99 change capitalization, hierarchy, spelling, and punctuation for purposes of style and uniformity; correct manifest 100 grammatical, clerical, and typographical errors; revise 101 102 internal or external citations and cross-references; harmonize 103 language; and translate effective dates.

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#### END PROPOSED AMENDMENT

105 Section 2. An election upon the proposed amendment 106 shall be held in accordance with Sections 284, 284.01, and 285 107 of the Constitution of Alabama of 2022, and the election laws 108 of this state. The appropriate election official shall assign 109 a ballot number for the proposed constitutional amendment on the election ballot and shall set forth the following 110 description of the substance or subject matter of the proposed 111 112 constitutional amendment:



113 "Relating to Baldwin County, proposing an amendment to 114 the Constitution of Alabama of 2022, to provide for the continuation of the existing levy of a two mill ad valorem tax 115 116 for public hospital purposes in election precincts one, two, 117 four, five, six, seven, eleven, twelve, thirteen, fourteen, 118 fifteen, sixteen, seventeen, eighteen, nineteen, twenty-one, 119 twenty-six, twenty-seven, and forty-five in the county. 120 Proposed by Act ." 121 This description shall be followed by the following 122 language: 123 "Yes() No()." Section 3. The proposed amendment shall become valid as 124 part of the Constitution of Alabama of 2022, when approved by 125

126 a majority of the qualified electors voting thereon.
