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4	SYNOPSIS:
5	Under existing law, the Alabama Student Grant
6	Program, administered by the Alabama Commission on
7	Higher Education, awards grants to students to attend
8	certain approved independent Alabama institutions of
9	higher education.
10	This bill would add any independent historically
11	Black college or university (HBCU) located in Selma,
12	Alabama, to the list of institutions approved to
13	participate in the grant program.
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16	A BILL
17	TO BE ENTITLED
18	AN ACT
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20	To amend Section 16-33A-1, Code of Alabama 1975,
21	relating to the Alabama Student Grant Program; to add any
22	independent historically Black college or university (HBCU)
23	located in Selma, Alabama, to the list of institutions
24	approved to participate in the grant program.
25	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:
26	Section 1. Section 16-33A-1 of the Code of Alabama
27	1975, is amended to read as follows:
28	"§16-33A-1





As used in this chapter, unless the context requires

otherwise, the following terms—shall have the following

meanings—respectively ascribed to them by this section:

- (1) ACHE. The Alabama Commission on Higher Education.
- (2) ALABAMA RESIDENT. A person An individual who has been domiciled in the State of Alabama for a period of at least 12 consecutive months immediately preceding application for a grant under the Alabama Student Grant Program program.

 The ACHE shall promulgate adopt and enforce regulations rules further defining and limiting the term domicile so as to limit the benefits of this legislation chapter to bona fide Alabama citizens residents, based upon criteria including residency of parents and guardians, voter registration of students and parents, driver's license registration, and other facts indicating bona fide citizenship residency.
- 44 (3) APPROVED INSTITUTION. a. Includes all of the following:
 - 1. Any independent nonprofit postsecondary institution of higher learning located in the State of Alabama which is accredited by the Commission on Colleges of the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools, any.
 - 2. Any independent nonprofit postsecondary institution of higher learning whose credits are accepted by at least three other institutions which are accredited by the Commission on Colleges of the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools, or any
 - 3. Any independent postsecondary institution of higher learning with a permanent facility offering classroom



instruction located in Montgomery County, Alabama, which has
been incorporated and in continuous operation for over 50
years and which has been accredited for over 10 years by the
Commission on Colleges of the Southern Association of Colleges
and Schools, prior to July 1, 2010.

- 4. Any independent postsecondary historically Black college or university (HBCU) located in Selma, Alabama, that is accredited by a federally recognized accreditation agency.
- b. Such an An approved institution must have an academic curriculum which is not comprised principally of sectarian instruction or preparation of students for a sectarian vocation and which does not award primarily theologian or seminarian degrees. To the extent that any such institution may have a religious or denominational affiliation, it the institution must perform essentially secular educational functions which are distinct and separable from religious activity. Such an An approved institution must not discriminate in its admissions practices on the basis of religious or denominational preference.
- c. No independent postsecondary institution of higher learning shall be considered an approved institution during any fiscal year in which it the institution receives a direct appropriation from the State of Alabama. Nothing contained herein in this subdivision shall be construed to limit, replace, or diminish any direct state appropriation now being made or which shall hereafter be made to any independent institution of higher learning.
 - (4) ELIGIBLE STUDENT. Any applicant for a grant under

- 86 a. Has obtained a certificate of graduation from a
- 87 secondary school or the recognized equivalent of such
- 88 graduation; and
- b. Is classified as an undergraduate student, as
- 90 defined in this chapter; and
- 91 c. Is an Alabama resident, as defined in this chapter;
- 92 and
- d. Is a citizen of the United States or in the process
- 94 of becoming a citizen of the United States; and
- e. Is enrolled or accepted for enrollment as a
- 96 full-time or part-time student in a program of at least six
- 97 months' duration in an approved institution as defined in this
- 98 chapter; and
- 99 f. Is not enrolled and does not intend to enroll in a
- 100 course of study leading to an undergraduate degree in theology
- 101 or divinity.
- 102 (5) FULL-TIME STUDENT. An individual student who meets
- 103 the criteria established by definitions, and rules, and
- 104 regulations to be established adopted by the ACHE.
- 105 (6) GRANT. A monetary award under the Alabama Student
- 106 Grant Program program to an approved institution on behalf of
- and to the credit of an eligible student pursuant to this
- 108 chapter.
- 109 (7) INSTITUTIONAL RELATED EXPENSES. Nonsectarian
- 110 educational expenses, including, but not limited to, tuition,
- 111 mandatory fees, room and board, transportation, books and
- supplies, and other incidental nonsectarian education expenses



- anticipated by an eligible student.
- 114 (8) PART-TIME STUDENT. An individual student who meets
- all qualifications as an eligible student and who meets the
- 116 further criteria to be established by the ACHE.
- 117 (9) PROGRAM. The Alabama Student Grant Program,
- including the administration thereof.
- 119 (10) UNDERGRADUATE STUDENT. Any individual student who
- 120 meets all other qualifications as an eligible student and has
- 121 not received a baccalaureate degree or its equivalent."
- 122 Section 2. This act shall become effective on July 1,
- 123 2025.
