9	Relating to Escambia County; to amend Sections
L 0	45-27-60.01, 45-27-60.02, 45-27-60.03, 45-27-60.04,
1	45-27-60.06, 45-27-60.07, 45-27-60.12, and 45-27-60.15, Code
12	of Alabama 1975; to further provide for the powers, duties,
13	and appointment of the county medical examiner; and to repeal
L 4	Section 45-27-60.14, Code of Alabama 1975, relating to the
L 5	compensation of the county medical examiner.
L 6	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:
L7	Section 1. Sections 45-27-60.01, 45-27-60.02,
L 8	45-27-60.03, 45-27-60.04, 45-27-60.06, 45-27-60.07,
L 9	45-27-60.12, and 45-27-60.15, Code of Alabama 1975, are
20	amended to read as follows:
21	"§45-27-60.01
22	(a) The county medical examiner Escambia County Medical
23	Examiner shall be a physician licensed to practice medicine in
24	Alabama.
25	(b) The Escambia County Medical Examiner county medical
26	<pre>examiner shall be appointed by the senior state medical</pre>
27	examiner in Region IV of the Alabama Department of Forensic
28	Sciences The appointment shall be made with the approval of



29	the Director of the Alabama Department of Forensic Sciences,
30	from a list of qualified physicians candidates submitted by
31	the Escambia County Medical Society after review by the
32	district attorney of the county a nominating committee
33	consisting of all of the following individuals:
34	(1) The Chair of the Escambia County Commission, or his
35	or her designee.
36	(2) The Escambia County District Attorney, or his or
37	her designee.
38	(3) The Sheriff of Escambia County, or his or her
39	designee.
40	(4) The Chief Medical Examiner of the Alabama
41	Department of Forensic Sciences, or his or her designee.
42	(c) The nominating committee shall submit a list to the
43	director at least 90 days before the end of a term.
44	(d) The appointment shall establish the Escambia County
45	Medical Examiner county medical examiner as a contract
46	employee an agent of the Alabama Department of Forensic
47	Sciences with the same liability coverage as provided to Merit
48	System employees of the State of Alabama.
49	(e) The county medical examiner shall serve a term of
50	six years beginning the first Monday after the second Tuesday
51	in January in the same manner and cycle as the Escambia County
52	District Attorney.
53	(f) The first county medical examiner appointed after
54	October 1, 2025, shall serve until the expiration of the
55	current district attorney term on January 20, 2029.
56	(a) If a vacancy occurs during a term the Director of

57	the Alabama Department of Forensic Sciences shall appoint an
58	interim county medical examiner within 14 days of the vacancy
59	The nominating committee shall submit a list to the director
60	within 90 days of the vacancy, after which the director shall
61	make an appointment to serve the remainder of the term.
62	(h) The Director of the Alabama Department of Forensic
63	Sciences may waive the requirement that the county medical
64	examiner be a physician when appointing an interim county
65	<pre>medical examiner."</pre>

67	The Escambia County Medical Examiner shall may appoint
68	one or more assistant county medical examiners to assist the
69	investigation and certification of deaths from the list of
70	qualified physicians provided by the Escambia County Medical
71	Society. Each assistant county medical examiner shall also
72	have approval of the senior medical examiner of Region IV and
73	the Director of the Alabama Department of Forensic Sciences
74	and also shall be a contract employee of the Alabama
75	Department of Forensic Sciences."

77	The county medical examiners examiner shall complete
78	eight hours of training in death investigation each year. The
79	Department of Forensic Sciences state medical examiners shall
80	<pre>may provide the training, or the county medical examiners may</pre>
81	attend other training in death investigation with prior
82	approval of the senior medical examiner of Region IV of the
83	Alabama Department of Forensic Sciences. All training shall be
84	approved for continuing medical education credits."

It shall be the duty of the county medical examiner, or designated assistant <u>county</u> medical <u>examinerexaminers</u>, to investigate any death in Escambia County when the death falls within one or more of the following categories:

- (1) Deaths that occur suddenly and unexpectedly, that is, when the person has not been under medical care for significant disease of the heart or lung, or other disease.
- 93 (2) Deaths suspected to be due to violence, resulting 94 from anyone of the following: Suicide, accident, homicide, or 95 undetermined injury, regardless of when or where the injury 96 occurred.
- 97 (3) Deaths suspected to be due to alcohol, or drugs, or 98 exposure to toxic agents.
- 99 (4) Deaths due to poisoning.
- 100 (5) Deaths of persons in the custody of law enforcement 101 officers or in penal institutions.
- 102 (6) Deaths suspected to be involved with the occupation of the decedent.
- 104 (7) Deaths unattended by a physician.
- 105 (8) Deaths due to neglect.
- 106 (9) Any stillbirth of 20 or more weeks gestation 107 unattended by a physician.
- 108 (10) Deaths due to criminal abortion.
- 109 (11) Any death of an infant or child under 19 years of
  110 age where the medical history has not established some
  111 preexisting medical condition to clearly explain the death and
  112 the preterminal circumstances.



- 113 (12) Deaths which are possibly directly or indirectly
  114 attributable to environmental exposure not otherwise
  115 specified.
- 116 (13) Deaths suspected to be caused by infectious or
  117 contagious disease wherein the diagnosis and extent of disease
  118 at the time are undetermined.
- 119 (14) Deaths occurring under suspicious or unusual circumstances.
- 121 (15) When a body is to be cremated, dissected, or 122 buried at sea.
- 123 (16) When a body is brought into Escambia County
  124 without proper medical certification."

- (a) After investigating a death, if the county medical 126 127 examiner or the a designated assistant is satisfied that the 128 death was not caused by criminal act or omission and that 129 there are no suspicious circumstances about the death, then 130 the county medical examiner, or designated assistant, may 131 execute a death certificate as required by law, and authorize 132 release of the body for final disposition on a certificate as 133 prescribed by the State Health Department.
- 134 (b) The county medical examiner shall contact <u>the</u>

  135 <u>office of the district attorney and the State Chief Medical</u>

  136 Examiner of <u>the Alabama Department of Forensic Sciences under</u>

  137 the following circumstances:
- 138 (1) If the deceased is unidentified.
- 139 (2) If the county medical examiner suspects a death was
  140 caused by a criminal act or omission.

- 141 (3) If the cause of death is obscure.
- 142 (c) The In the event of a death qualifying under subsection (b), the State Medical Examiner county medical 143 144 examiner shall further examine the body, take, retain, and 145 examine or have examined whatever tissues, biological fluids, 146 or other evidence from the body that he or she deems necessary 147 to determine the cause, manner, or circumstances of death, and the identity of the deceased. The county medical examiner or 148 149 state medical examiner shall then execute a death certificate, as required by law, and also shall authorize release of the 150 151 body for final disposition by executing a certificate required by the State Health Department." 152

- 154 (a) An In compliance with the provisions of Section
  155 36-18-2, an autopsy or postmortem examination may be performed
  156 by a state medical examiner at the written direction of the
  157 Governor, the Attorney General, a circuit judge, or the
  158 Escambia County District Attorney or his or her authorized
  159 representative in any case in which the Attorney General or
  160 the district attorney is conducting a criminal investigation.
  - (b) The county A state medical examiner or the State

    Medical Examiner may authorize an autopsy or postmortem

    examination, or the autopsy may be performed by the State

    Medical Examinera state medical examiner, when the county

    medical examiner suspects the death was caused by a criminal

    act or omission, or the cause of death is obscure or, in his

    or her opinion, an autopsy is advisable and in the public

    interest.

(c) In a death where the county medical examiner does not deem it advisable and in the public interest that an autopsy be performed, but the next of kin of the deceased requests that an autopsy be performed, the State Medical Examiner, or a designated pathologist, may perform the autopsy and the cost therefor shall be paid by the next of kin. The funds paid by the next of kin shall be deposited by the State Treasurer into the Forensic Services Trust Fund."

The county medical examiner shall maintain the reports of death investigations conducted by the Escambia County Medical Examiner and a copy shall be forwarded to the Region IV Laboratory of the Alabama Department of Forensic Sciences. These reports, or true copies thereof duly certified by the county medical examiner or the director of the department, are admissible in evidence in any court in Escambia County, with or without testimony by the county medical examiner or Department of Forensic Sciences officials, provided, any person preparing a report given in evidence pursuant to this article may be summoned as a witness in any civil or criminal case by either party to the cause."

Upon Beginning January 15, 1998, title and control of all equipment in the office of the Escambia County Coroner shall be transferred by Escambia County the county to the county medical examiner and to the Alabama Department of Forensic Sciences. The Escambia County Commission shall establish a Medical Examiner Fund. Thereafter, all funds



197	previously appropriated by the county commission to the office
198	of coroner shall be appropriated to the Medical Examiner Fund.
199	The appropriation shall be in the amount agreed to between the
200	county commission and the Alabama Department of Forensic
201	Sciences county medical examiner's office each year, but the
202	amount shall not be less than the amount appropriated to the
203	office of the coroner in the Escambia County 1997-98 fiscal
204	year budget. The senior state medical examiner in Region IV of
205	the Alabama Department of Forensic Sciences, in conjunction
206	with the Escambia County Medical Examiner, shall review the
207	funding of the county medical examiner each year with the
208	Escambia County Commission to assure adequate support for the
209	investigations of death in the county."
210	Section 2. Section 45-27-60.14, Code of Alabama 1975,
211	relating to the compensation of the county medical examiner,
212	is repealed.
213	Section 3. This act shall become effective on October
214	1, 2025.
