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4	SYNOPSIS:
5	Under existing law, the endorsement of a
6	certified registered nurse practitioner or certified
7	nurse midwife is deemed to be the endorsement of a
8	physician for certain documents.
9	This bill would specifically provide that the
10	endorsement of a certified registered nurse
11	practitioner or certified nurse midwife on a physical
12	examination form for participation of a student in K-12
13	school athletics is deemed the endorsement of a
14	physician.

Relating to certified registered nurse practitioners; to amend Section 34-21-93.1, Code of Alabama 1975; to provide that an endorsement by a certified registered nurse practitioner or certified nurse midwife on a physical examination form for participation in school athletics satisfies any requirement for the endorsement of a physician on the required form.

28 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:

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- Section 1. Section 34-21-93.1 of the Code of Alabama
- 30 1975, is amended to read as follows:
- 31 "\$34-21-93.1
- 32 (a) When any law or rule requires a signature,
- 33 certification, stamp, verification, affidavit, or endorsement
- 34 by a physician, the document shall be deemed to authorize a
- 35 signature, certification, stamp, verification, affidavit, or
- 36 endorsement by a certified registered nurse practitioner or
- 37 certified nurse midwife for the items listed in this section.
- 38 The authority in this section for a certified registered nurse
- 39 practitioner and a certified nurse midwife shall be subject to
- 40 an active collaboration agreement. This section applies to all
- 41 of the following:
- 42 (1) Certification of disability for patients to receive
- 43 special access parking or disability access parking tags or
- 44 placards.
- 45 (2) A signature required for any of the following:
- a. The following documents that require a complete
- 47 history and physical examination consistent with the examining
- 48 provider's scope of practice and certification:
- 1. Physicals for bus drivers in this state using State
- of Alabama forms.
- 2. Physicals to verify eligibility for students to
- 52 participate in the Special Olympics.
- 3. Employment and pre-employment physicals for
- 54 Transportation Security Agency (TSA) employees at an airport
- or for governmental employees such as firefighters and law
- 56 enforcement officers.

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- 57 4. Adoptive parent applications.
- 5. College or trade school physicals.
- 59 6. Boy Scout or Girl Scout physicals or physical
- 60 required by similar organizations.
- 7. Physicals to verify eligibility for students to
- 62 participate in K-12 school athletic activities including, but
- 63 not limited to, interscholastic athletic activities.
- b. Forms excusing a potential jury member due to an
- 65 illness.
- c. Forms relating to absenteeism for employment or
- 67 school purposes, including, but not limited to, documents
- associated with the federal Family and Medical Leave Act.
- d. Authorizations for durable medical equipment.
- 70 e. Authorizations for diabetic testing supplies.
- f. Authorization for diabetic shoes.
- 72 g. Home health recertification orders after initial
- 73 certification.
- 74 h. Within the state Medicaid system, any and all forms
- 75 for the ordering of medications, nutritional supplements, or
- 76 infant formulas, or referrals to providers of medical
- 77 specialties, home health services, and physical or occupation
- 78 therapy.
- 79 i. Death certificates.
- j. Forms, including physical examination forms, needed
- 81 for certifications in residential or inpatient dwellings
- 82 within the Department of Mental Health.
- 83 k. Forms for ambulance transport.
- 1. Forms for donor breast milk.

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- m. Required documentation allowing a diabetic to renew or obtain a driver's license.
- 87 (b) Additional forms may be approved by rule under the 88 Alabama Administrative Procedure Act by the State Board of 89 Medical Examiners, after consulting with the state 90 professional society of nurse practitioners, the state 91 professional society of nurse midwives, the state professional 92 society of physicians, or the Joint Committee of the State 93 Board of Medical Examiners and the Board of Nursing for Advanced Practice Nurses as established by Section 34-21-81, 94 95 whichever is appropriate.
- 96 (c) This section shall not be construed to expand the 97 scope of practice for any certified registered nurse 98 practitioner or certified nurse midwife.

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- (d) This section does not expand the scope of a collaborative physician's responsibility with regard to nurse practitioners or nurse midwives under the laws of this state.
- (e) Any document signed or otherwise endorsed by a

 certified registered nurse practitioner or certified nurse

 midwife in lieu of a physician pursuant to this section shall

 be accepted as valid and lawful by the organization or entity

 requesting a physician's signature."
- 107 Section 2. This act shall become effective on October 108 1, 2025.
