4 SYNOPSIS:

Under existing law, an individual who is retired 5 6 under the Employees' Retirement System, has the 7 applicable Alabama Peace Officers' Standards and Training Certification, and was classified as a law 8 9 enforcement officer or a state policeman prior to retirement may work as a school resource officer or a 10 11 correctional officer without suspension of his or her retirement allowance, provided that his or her 12 13 compensation does not exceed \$52,000 per year.

14 This bill would further provide that an 15 individual who is retired under the Employees' Retirement System, has the applicable Alabama Peace 16 17 Officers' Standards and Training Certification, and was 18 classified as a law enforcement officer or a state 19 policeman prior to retirement may work as a police 20 officer at any state college or university without 21 suspension of his or her retirement allowance, provided 22 that his or her compensation does not exceed \$52,000 23 per year.

This bill would also extend the ability of certain individuals to work as a school resource officer or a correctional officer without suspension of the individual's retirement allowance from 2026 to 28 2030.

35	Relating to retired law enforcement officers; to amend
36	Section 36-27-8.2, Code of Alabama 1975, as last amended by
37	Act 2024-279, 2024 Regular Session, to further provide for the
38	employment of certain retired law enforcement officers; and to
39	extend the period during which certain retired law enforcement
40	officers may be employed in certain circumstances without
41	suspension of their retirement allowance.
42	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:
43	Section 1. Section 36-27-8.2, Code of Alabama 1975, as
44	last amended by Act 2024-279, 2024 Regular Session, is amended
45	to read as follows:
46	"\$36-27-8.2
47	(a) Any individual who is retired under the Employees'
48	Retirement System may perform duties in any capacity,
49	including as an independent contractor, with any employer
50	participating in the Employees' Retirement System or the
51	Teachers' Retirement System without suspension of his or her
52	retirement allowance provided that: (i) the individual is not
53	employed in a permanent full-time capacity; and (ii) the
54	individual's compensation from the employer in calendar year
55	2016 does not exceed thirty thousand dollars (\$30,000).
56	Beginning in calendar year 2017, and each calendar year



57 thereafter, the annual earning limit shall be increased by the 58 same percentage increase as the increase in the Consumer Price 59 Index for all urban consumers as published by the U.S. 60 Department of Labor, Bureau of Labor Statistics. Any increase in the annual earning limit shall be rounded to the next 61 62 lowest multiple of one thousand dollars (\$1,000) with any 63 amount in excess of the one thousand dollar (\$1,000) multiple 64 considered in determining the increase for the following year. 65 Each adjustment shall be based on the increase in the index for the preceding 12-month period ending on September 30, and 66 67 the increase shall be effective for the following calendar 68 year.

(b) Any individual serving as an elected official who 69 70 has retired from the Employees' Retirement System may serve 71 for his or her full compensation in an elected public office 72 with the state, a county, or an incorporated municipality 73 without suspension of retirement benefits; provided, that 74 under no circumstances shall such an individual participate in 75 or accrue additional benefits under the Teachers' Retirement 76 System or the Employees' Retirement System for that service, 77 and provided that under no circumstances shall an individual 78 whose retirement is based upon service as an elected official 79 continue in or return to the office and receive both pension 80 benefits and salary. Any provision of this subsection to the 81 contrary notwithstanding, a retiree serving as a local elected superintendent of education shall not receive both pension 82 benefits and salary unless his or her compensation as a local 83 84 elected superintendent of education does not exceed the annual



85 earning limits provided in subsection (a).

86 (c) The responsibility for compliance with this section 87 is placed upon the employing authority, and each retiree 88 performing duties under this section shall certify to the employer any information required in order to carry out this 89 90 section. The retiree shall provide written notice of the 91 postretirement employment under this section to the Employees' 92 Retirement System and employing authority within 30 days after 93 the date the retiree knows or should know that he or she will be performing duties on a full-time or permanent basis or will 94 95 earn an amount in excess of the annual earning limit under this section. 96

97 (d) (1) Any individual who is retired under the 98 Employees' Retirement System, has the applicable Alabama Peace 99 Officers' Standards and Training certification, and was classified as either a law enforcement officer, as defined in 100 Section 36-27-59, or a state policeman, as defined in Section 101 102 36-27-1, prior to retirement, may perform duties as either a 103 school resource officer, as defined in Section 16-1-44.1, or a 104 correctional officer with the Department of Corrections, or a 105 police officer at any state college or university pursuant to 106 Section 16-22-1 without suspension of his or her retirement 107 allowance, provided that the compensation earned does not 108 exceed fifty-two thousand dollars (\$52,000) per year.

109 (2) Any individual who is retired under the Employees' 110 Retirement System, has the applicable Alabama Peace Officers' 111 Standards and Training certification, and meets any of the 112 following criteria, may perform duties as a correctional



113	officer with the Department of Corrections without suspension
114	of his or her retirement allowance, provided that the
115	compensation earned does not exceed fifty-two thousand dollars
116	(\$52,000) per year:
117	a. Was classified as a law enforcement officer, as
118	defined in Section 36-27-59, prior to retirement.
119	b. Was classified as a state policeman, as defined in
120	Section 36-27-1, prior to retirement.
121	c. Was classified as a correctional officer, as defined
122	in Section 36-27-59, prior to retirement, and retired pursuant
123	to Section 36-27-16(a)(1)c.
124	(3) No individual may be employed pursuant to this
125	subsection after December 31, <del>2026</del> 2030."
126	Section 2. This act shall become effective on June 1,
127	2025.
