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SYNOPSIS:

Under existing law, parents have certain rights to manage their minor child's exposure to different environments or experiences.

This bill would prohibit public K-12 schools and public libraries from knowingly presenting or sponsoring drag performances in the presence of a minor without the consent of the minor's parent or legal guardian.

This bill would also prohibit certain state entities from allowing minors to share certain facilities with members of the opposite sex during overnight programs operated or sponsored by the state entity, unless the other individuals are family members of the minor and the minor's parent consents.

Relating to parental rights; to prohibit public K-12 schools and public libraries from presenting or sponsoring certain performances in certain circumstances; and to prohibit certain state entities from allowing minors to share certain

31 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:

32 Section 1. For the purposes of this act, the following  
33 terms have the following meanings:

34 (1) DRAG PERFORMANCE. A performance in which a  
35 performer exhibits a sex identity that is different from the  
36 sex assigned to the performer at birth using clothing, makeup,  
37 or other physical markers.

38 (2) SEX. The state of being male or female as observed  
39 or clinically verified at birth.

40 Section 2. A public K-12 school or public library shall  
41 not knowingly present or sponsor any drag performance in the  
42 presence of a minor without the consent of the minor's parent  
43 or legal guardian.

44 Section 3. During any overnight program for minors  
45 operated or sponsored by any state department, agency, board,  
46 or commission where attendees share multi-occupancy bathrooms,  
47 changing facilities, or sleeping quarters, no minor shall  
48 share a multi-occupancy bathroom, changing facility, or  
49 sleeping quarter with a member of the opposite sex unless the  
50 individuals are members of the same family, such as a parent,  
51 legal guardian, sibling, or grandparent, and the minor has  
52 received approval from the parent or legal guardian to do so.

53 Section 4. This act shall become effective on October  
54 1, 2025.
