5	This bill would increase the fees for volunteer
6	and professional firefighter distinctive motor vehicle
7	license plates and would provide for the distribution
8	of the fees collected.

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15	Relating to motor vehicle registration; to amend
16	Sections 32-6-271 and 32-6-280, Code of Alabama 1975, to
17	increase the fees for volunteer and professional firefighter
18	distinctive motor vehicle license plates and to provide for
19	the distribution of the fees collected.
20	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:
21	Section 1. Sections 32-6-271 and 32-6-280, Code of
22	Alabama 1975, are amended to read as follows:
23	" §32-6-271
24	(a) A firefighter, upon application and subject to this
25	division, may be issued a distinctive motor vehicle license
26	plate as identification as a firefighter. In addition to the
27	proper numbers, words, and insignias used on the standard

license plate issued for motor vehicles, the distinctive





- 29 plates issued to firefighters shall bear a red Maltese cross 30 emblem on each side to the left and right of the regular tag numbers. The words word "Fire Fighter" should be centered at 31 32 the bottom of the license plate.
- 33 (b) In addition to any other fees provided for by law, an annual additional fee of one dollar (\$1.00) ten dollars 34 35 (\$10) is added to the cost of the firefighter distinctive 36 license plate provided for in this division, effective January 37 1, 2022. The annual additional fee combined fees collected pursuant to this section shall be distributed by each 38 39 licensing official to the state Comptroller. The state Comptroller, who shall distribute the total net proceeds 40 monthly as follows: 41
- (1) Fifty cents (\$.50) One dollar fifty cents (\$1.50) shall be deposited into a fund managed by the Alabama Joint Fire Council and shall be used for the purpose of expanding and maintaining the Alabama Firefighter Memorial located in 46 Tuscaloosa.

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- (2) Fifty cents (\$.50) One dollar fifty cents (\$1.50) shall be distributed to the Alabama Joint Fire Council to be used for expenses associated with the Firefighter Peer Support Program.
- 51 (3) Three dollars fifty cents (\$3.50) shall be 52 distributed to the board of the Alabama Firefighters Annuity 53 and Benefit Fund.
- 54 (4) Three dollars fifty cents (\$3.50) shall be 55 distributed to the secretary-treasurer of the State of Alabama 56 Firefighters Emergency Relief Fund.





- (c) The funds generated by this the additional fees under subsection (b) shall be subject to audit from either the Department of Examiners of Public Accounts or an independent certified public accountant once every three calendar years effective January 1, 2022."

- 63 (a) As used in this <u>section</u> <u>division</u>, the following 64 terms <u>shall</u> have the following meanings:
 - (1) Professional firefighter PROFESSIONAL FIREFIGHTER.

 means aA paid member of a paid or part-paid fire department of a city, town, county, or other subdivision of the state, including the chief, assistant chief, warden, engineer, captain, firemen firefighters, and all other officers and employees of the department who actually engage in firefighting firefighting or rendering first aid at the scene of an accident.
 - PROFESSIONAL FIREFIGHTER. means and retired member of a paid or part-paid fire department of a city, town, county, or other subdivision of the state, including the chief, assistant chief, warden, engineer, captain, firemen firefighters, and all other officers and employees of the department who actually engaged in fire fighting firefighting or rendering first aid at the scene of an accident. Notwithstanding any other provision of this division, retired professional firefighter the term includes a retired professional firefighter who is a resident of this state and who has retired from a professional fire department in another state



and otherwise meets the requirements of this section division.

- (b) (1) Notwithstanding Sections 32-6-64, 32-6-67, and 32-6-68, a professional firefighter or a retired professional firefighter, upon application and subject to the provisions of this section division, may be issued a distinctive motor vehicle license plate as identification as a professional firefighter or a retired professional firefighter, and a professional firefighter, upon application and subject to this section, may be issued a distinctive motor vehicle license plate as identification as a professional firefighter.
- insignias used on the standard license plate issued for motor vehicles, the distinctive plates so license plate issued for a retired professional firefighter shall have a design created by the state association of professional firefighters in coordination with the Mobile Retired Firefighters and Paramedics Association and the Tuscaloosa Retired Firefighters Association, and the distinctive license plate—so issued for a professional firefighter shall have a design created by the state association of professional firefighters.
- (c) (1) The distinctive license plates provided herein shall be approved by the Commissioner of Revenue and shall be issued through the judge of probate, license commissioner, or other license issuing official of the several counties of the state in the same manner as are other motor vehicle license plates, and the officers shall be entitled to their regular fees for the service.
 - (2) By December 1 of each year, the Firefighters'

113	Personnel Standards and Education Commission shall submit to
114	the judge of probate, the license commissioner, or other
115	license issuing official of each county a list of eligible
116	professional firefighters and retired professional
117	firefighters retired from paid or part-paid fire departments
118	under this section. The Firefighters' Personnel Standards and
119	Education Commission shall also add to the list any retired
120	professional firefighter retired from a paid or part-paid fire
121	department in from another state who submits proof to the
122	commission of eligibility pursuant to this division. The
123	Firefighters' Personnel Standards and Education Commission
124	shall also submit to the judge of probate, the license
125	commissioner, or other license issuing official of each county
126	a list of eligible professional firefighters from paid or
127	part-paid fire departments.

(3) Any person individual who joins a paid or part-paid fire department after December 1 of any year or any person individual who is omitted from the list prepared as described in subdivision (2) may obtain a distinctive license plate by presenting to the license issuing official proof of his or her membership in a paid or part-paid fire department by means of a certificate signed by the chief of the department on a form prescribed by the Firefighters' Personnel Standards and Education Commission.

(4) Upon the initial application for a retired professional firefighter distinctive license plate under this section, an applicant for a distinctive license plate provided in this section shall present to the judge of probate, the



license commissioner, or other license issuing official of the county, proof of his or her retirement from a fire department that is included on the list provided by the Firefighters' Personnel Standards and Education Commission. Proof of the person's individual's retirement from a fire department included on the that list from the Firefighters' Personnel Standards and Education Commission is not required for renewal of the distinctive license plate.

- (5) Upon the applicant submitting proof of his or her identification, the professional firefighter or retired professional firefighter shall be issued the requested number of distinctive license plates upon the payment of the regular fee for license plates, as provided by law, but shall not be required to pay the three dollar (\$3) fee.
- (6) Upon the applicant submitting proof of his or her identification, the retired professional firefighter shall be issued the requested number of distinctive license plates upon the payment of the regular license fee for plates, as provided by law, but shall not be required to pay the three dollar (\$3) fee.

(7) (6) The distinctive license plates so issued shall be used only upon and for personally owned, private passenger vehicles, to include station wagons and pick-up trucks, registered in the name of the retired professional firefighter or professional firefighter making application therefor, and when so issued to the applicant shall be used upon the vehicle for which issued in lieu of the standard license plates normally issued for the vehicle.

 - b.c. The funds generated by this the additional fee shall be subject to audit from either the Department of Examiners of Public Accounts or an independent certified public accountant once every three calendar years effective January 1, 2022.
 - (9) (8) Anyone who is proven to have either falsely obtained or certified an individual to obtain a distinctive professional firefighter or retired professional firefighter license plate or a distinctive professional firefighter license plate shall be guilty of a Class C misdemeanor, and upon conviction, shall be punished according to law.
- 215 (d) Retired professional firefighters firefighter 216 distinctive license plates and professional firefighter 217 distinctive license plates as provided by this section shall 218 be prepared and furnished for the licensing year commencing 219 January 1, 2012, and thereafter as is provided by law for the issuance of other license plates. Professional firefighters 220 221 distinctive license plates as provided by this section shall be prepared and furnished for the licensing year commencing 222 January 1, 2016, and thereafter as is provided by law for the 223 224 issuance of other license plates.



225	(e) The Department of Revenue may adopt any rules
226	necessary to administer this section division."
