5	Under existing law, human trafficking in the
6	second degree is a Class B felony.
7	This bill would provide that knowingly
8	advertising, either online or in print, access to the
9	sexual or labor servitude of another is human
10	trafficking in the second degree.
11	This bill would also make nonsubstantive,
12	technical revisions to update the existing code

21	Relating to crimes and offenses; to amend Section
22	13A-6-153, Code of Alabama 1975; to further provide for the
23	crime of human trafficking in the second degree; and to make
24	nonsubstantive, technical revisions to update the existing
25	code language to current style.
26	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:
27	Section 1. Section 13A-6-153, Code of Alabama 1975, is
28	amended to read as follows:



29 "\$13A-6-153

30 (a) A person commits the crime of human trafficking in31 the second degree if:

32 (1) <u>A person <u>He or she</u> knowingly benefits, financially 33 or by receiving anything of value, from participation in a 34 venture or engagement for the purpose of sexual servitude or 35 labor servitude.</u>

36 (2) <u>A person <u>He or she</u> knowingly recruits, entices,
37 solicits, induces, harbors, transports, holds, restrains,
38 provides, maintains, subjects, or obtains by any means another
39 person for the purpose of labor servitude or sexual servitude.

(3) He or she knowingly advertises, either online or in print, access to the sexual or labor servitude of another.

42 (3) (b) A corporation, or any other legal entity other 43 than an individual, may be prosecuted for human trafficking in the second degree for an act or omission only if an agent of 44 45 the corporation or entity performs the conduct which is an 46 element of the crime while acting within the scope of his or 47 her office or employment and on behalf of the corporation or 48 entity, and the commission of the crime was either authorized, 49 requested, commanded, performed, or within the scope of the 50 person's employment on behalf of the corporation or entity or constituted a pattern of conduct that an agent of the 51 52 corporation or entity knew or should have known was occurring.

53 (4)(c) Any person who obstructs, or attempts to 54 obstruct, or in any way interferes with or prevents the 55 enforcement of this section shall be guilty of a Class B 56 felony.
