9	Relating to medical clinic boards; to add Section
10	11-58-5.2 to the Code of Alabama 1975; to authorize medical
11	clinic boards to readjust debt pursuant to federal bankruptcy
12	law in certain circumstances.
13	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:
14	Section 1. Section 11-58-5.2 is added to the Code of
15	Alabama 1975, to read as follows:
16	§11-58-5.2
17	(a) This section shall apply to any medical clinic
18	board that leases property to a licensed acute care hospital
19	or general health care provider that has voluntarily filed for
20	Chapter 11 bankruptcy under the United States Bankruptcy Code.
21	(b) A medical clinic board meeting the requirements of
22	subsection (a) shall have the power to take all steps and
23	proceedings contemplated or permitted by any act of the
24	Congress of the United States relating to the readjustment of
25	municipal indebtedness including, without limitation, the
26	commencement of a case under the United States Bankruptcy
27	Code, and the State of Alabama hereby gives its assent thereto
28	and hereby authorizes such a medical clinic board to proceed

under the federal acts for the readjustment of its debts. 29 30 (c) (1) The members of the board of directors of a medical clinic board authorized under this section to pursue 31 32 readjustment of its debts shall be immune from suit and 33 liability, both personally and in their official capacity, for 34 any claim for damage to or loss of property or personal injury 35 or other civil liability caused by or arising out of any 36 actual or alleged act, error, or omission that occurred, or 37 that the member against whom the claim is made had a reasonable basis for believing occurred, within the scope of 38 39 board employment, duties, or responsibilities. 40 (2) Nothing in this subsection shall be construed to 41 protect any member from suit or liability for any damage, loss, injury, or liability caused by the intentional, willful, 42 43 or wanton misconduct of that member. (3) The procurement of insurance of any type by the 44 board of directors does not in any way compromise or limit the 45 46 immunity granted by this subsection.

Section 2. This act shall become effective immediately.
