7	WHEREAS, the Marquis de Lafayette was a French
8	nobleman and military officer who volunteered to serve in
9	the Continental Army during the American Revolution, was
10	commissioned as a Major General on the staff of General
11	George Washington, and subsequently became General
12	Washington's trusted aide and protégé; and
13	WHEREAS, Major General Lafayette played an essential
14	role in delivering French ships, troops, and provisions to
15	the Revolutionary cause and commanded American forces at the
16	decisive Siege of Yorktown in 1781, ushering American
17	victory in the war and making Lafayette beloved in the
18	hearts of the new nation; and
19	WHEREAS, in 1824, 50 years after the convening of the
20	First Continental Congress, President James Monroe invited
21	Lafayette to tour the United States in commemoration of the
22	American Revolution and to revive American passion for the
23	founding principles of liberty and equality during a time of
24	great political division; and
25	WHEREAS, Lafayette, the last surviving Major General
26	of the Continental Army, visited all 24 existing states
27	between August 1824 and September 1825 and was celebrated by

29	Lafayette and his contemporaries; and
30	WHEREAS, Lafayette spent nine days in the young state
31	of Alabama, visiting Ft. Mitchell along the Chattahoochee
32	River, Lucas Tavern at the western edge of the Creek Nation,
33	the City of Montgomery, the State Capital at Cahawba, the
34	Town of Claiborne, and the City of Mobile before departing
35	for New Orleans; and
36	WHEREAS, a series of commemorative events for K-12
37	students and the general public will take place commencing
38	March 30, 2025, and ending April 8, 2025, in communities
39	along the route taken by Lafayette; and
40	WHEREAS, remembering Lafayette's visit is an occasion
41	to recall the importance of the revolutionary principles of
42	liberty and equality secured by the founding generation and
43	essential to the health and success of our nation today; now
44	therefore,
45	BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA, BOTH
46	HOUSES THEREOF CONCURRING, That the bicentennial of the
47	visit of the Marquis de Lafayette to Alabama be commemorated
48	with celebration and appreciation for the unifying effect of
49	Lafayette's presence, and that the Alabama organizations
50	partnering to mark this anniversary be commended for
51	creating opportunities for education and patriotic
52	reflection on the part of this great state's citizens.
53	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That each entity hosting
54	commemorative events marking the bicentennial be delivered a
55	copy of this resolution in recognition of their service to
56	the public and to our shared American ideals.
