3 CELEBRATING THE 100TH BIRTHDAY OF SUE CARPENTER ANDRESS.

4 WHEREAS, with great pride and special pleasure,
5 joyful felicitations are conveyed to Sue Carpenter Andress
6 on the occasion of her centennial birthday; and

7 WHEREAS, born Willie Sue Carpenter on May 30, 1925,
8 to Effie Washington and Samuel William Carpenter in Wedowee,
9 Alabama, she was one of 10 children in her family, though
10 she lost one sister at a very early age; she was educated at
11 New Hope School in Randolph County from first grade through
12 part of her high school years; she transferred to and
13 graduated from Randolph County High School, Class of 1943;

15 WHEREAS, World War II was raging in Europe when Sue
16 graduated high school and she joined the war effort by
17 making rubberized linings for the inside of airplane fuel
18 tanks in Gadsden, Alabama; when the war ended, Sue moved to
19 Birmingham for a time to work for Southern Bell; she began
20 her college education at the Alabama Polytechnic Institute,
21 now Auburn University, where she graduated with a degree in
22 Food and Nutrition in 1948; while she was attending the
23 university, she met the love of her life, John Andress; they
24 married on June 8, 1947, and shared 50 wonderful years
25 together rearing their three children, Randal, Allan, and
26 Brenda; and

27 WHEREAS, when D.W. McMillan Memorial Hospital opened
28 its doors in 1954, it did so with Sue Andress as its

29 dietitian; she later began a career in education that
30 spanned 25 years, retiring in 1985; she taught junior high
31 school and 9th grade Mathematics at W.S. Neal School; high
32 school Home Economics in Flomaton, Alabama; and Child Care
33 and Guidance at the Escambia-Brewton Area Vocational School;
34 she also worked in the adult education program at Jefferson
35 Davis Community College in Brewton; and volunteered at
36 Brewton Elementary School as a reading tutor for young
37 children; she was an active member of Alpha Delta Kappa
38 professional sorority for outstanding women educators; and

39 WHEREAS, Sue Andress devoted her life to Christ and
40 taught Sunday School at East Brewton Methodist Church and
41 Alco Methodist Church; she is currently a member of Brewton
42 First Methodist Church where she has been active in her
43 Sunday School Class and the Ladies Guild; she also has
44 enjoyed her YMCA membership, faithfully attending weekly
45 classes; she also enjoys spending time with her six
46 grandchildren, 10 great-grandchildren, and one
47 great-great-granddaughter, who all lovingly call her Granny
48 Sue; and

49 WHEREAS, a 100th birthday is a significant milestone
50 that represents a century of wisdom earned and memories
51 gained and is cause for great rejoicing; Sue remains a
52 source of inspiration to her family, neighbors, and friends,
53 who cherish every moment shared; now therefore,
