Neal School; high school Home Economics in Flomaton, Alabama; and Child Care and Guidance at the Escambia-Brewton Area Vocational School; she also worked in the adult education program at Jefferson Davis Community College in Brewton; and volunteered at Brewton Elementary School as a reading tutor for young children; she was an active member of Alpha Delta Kappa professional sorority for outstanding women educators; and
