25	2020, on the 55th Anniversary of the Historic Selma to
26	Montgomery March, Salute Selma partnered with the National
27	Pan-Hellenic Council to organize the first ever Black Women

31	WHEREAS, for three decades, Ms. Carter has led
32	successful efforts as the National Coordinator of the Bridge
33	Crossing Jubilee, Incorporated, an organization that founded
34	the annual reenactment of the 1965 Bridge Crossing, which
35	has brought hundreds of thousands of supporters to Selma,
36	including former Presidents Joe Biden, Bill Clinton, Barrack
37	Obama, and George W. Bush; and
38	WHEREAS, Catrena also founded Women of Will (WOW), a
39	nonprofit that has trained hundreds of women to run for
40	political office and headed the "Vote or Die" movement which
41	led to Doug Jones becoming the first United States Senator
42	representing the Democratic Party of Alabama; and
43	WHEREAS, Ms. Carter was Associate Publisher of the
44	publication "Who's Who in Black Alabama" and has over 20
45	years of award-winning hospitality experience; she was the
46	former Director of Sales and Marketing for the Historic
47	Redmont Hotel and the Tutwiler Hotel; she received national
48	recognition from Wyndham International as the 2010 Best of
49	by Request winner, before receiving the Restaurant and
50	Hospitality Association's prestigious Hospitality Manager of
51	the Year for the State of Alabama; in 2020, she received the
52	Best of Minority Business Award for nonprofits; in 2015, she
53	was nominated as one of al.com's Women Who Shape the State
