8	WHEREAS, more than a century ago, hunters and anglers
9	were among the first conservationists who realized America's
10	natural resources were in peril and could not sustain
11	unregulated harvest and habitat destruction; and
12	WHEREAS, sports men and women took it upon themselves
13	to support laws that stopped excessive harvesting of fish
14	and wildlife; established state agencies to protect fish,
15	wildlife, and their habitats; and supported special fishing
16	and hunting license fees to help fund the new agencies'
17	efforts to provide healthy natural resources for future
18	generations; and
19	WHEREAS, the House of Representatives then and now
20	recognizes that the primary authority to protect and manage
21	fish within their state waters resides in state agencies;
22	and
23	WHEREAS, upon realizing that license fees alone were
24	insufficient to restore and sustain healthy fish
25	populations, anglers supported excise taxes on fishing
26	equipment to raise additional funds to support restoration
27	and enhancement efforts of the state agencies; and

29	began 75 years ago with the passage of the Federal Aid in
30	Sport Fish Restoration Act in 1950, further expanded with
31	the Wallop-Breaux amendment to the Sport Fish Restoration
32	Act in 1984, is a vital part of conservation funding in the
33	United States; and
34	WHEREAS, a manufacturer's excise tax on fishing
35	equipment, along with an excise tax on motorboat and small
36	engine fuels, is mostly distributed back to the states
37	through the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service for fisheries
38	conservation, management, and angler and boater access; and
39	WHEREAS, this cooperative partnership among the
40	sportfishing industry, anglers, boaters, the U.S. Fish and
41	Wildlife Service, and state natural resource agencies has
42	resulted in the most successful model of fisheries
43	management in the world, restoring and enhancing populations
44	across the United States and its territories; and
45	WHEREAS, since 1939, the combined contribution of the
46	Wildlife and Sport Fish Restoration Programs and license
47	fees to state fish and wildlife agencies exceeds \$78
48	billion, more than any other single conservation effort in
49	American history, which constitutes, collectively, the
50	American System of Conservation Funding; now therefore,
51	BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE
52	LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA, That the House of Representatives
53	recognizes America's anglers, boaters, the sportfishing
54	industry, state fish and wildlife agencies, and the U.S.
