7 WHEREAS, Alpha Phi Alpha Fraternity, Incorporated, 8 the first intercollegiate Greek-letter fraternity 9 established for African Americans, was founded at Cornell 10 University in Ithaca, New York, on December 4, 1906, by Henry Arthur Callis, Charles Henry Chapman, Eugene Kinckle 11 Jones, George Biddle Kelley, Nathaniel Allison Murray, 12 13 Robert Harold Ogle, and Vertner Woodson Tandy, known as the 14 "Jewels"; who recognized the need for a strong bond of 15 brotherhood among African descendants in this country; and

16 WHEREAS, Alpha Phi Alpha Fraternity, Incorporated, 17 for 118 years has been a beacon of light to the community by 18 standing true to its aims of Manly Deeds, Scholarship, and 19 Love for all Mankind; and

20 WHEREAS, Alpha Phi Alpha Fraternity, Incorporated, 21 has produced over 200,000 members that were inducted into 22 706 college and alumni chapters in the United States, 23 Europe, Asia, and the Caribbean; and

24 WHEREAS, Alpha Phi Alpha Fraternity, Incorporated, 25 continues to make a difference in our society through the 26 fraternity's national programs of civic outreach initiatives 27 which accumulate over one million hours of community 28 service, producing \$2.5 million in scholarships, and
