7 WHEREAS, we note with sadness the death of John 8 Hollis "Johnny" Howell of Pinson, Alabama, on April 28, 9 2025, and we celebrate his 95 years of life with 10 thanksgiving; his warmth, intellect, and steadfast love for 11 his family and friends will be deeply missed; and

12 WHEREAS, John Howell was born on September 12, 1929, 13 in Birmingham, Alabama, and raised by a family who loved 14 him; he excelled in sports, and following graduation from 15 Ensley High School, he played football at Auburn University, 16 Howard College (now Samford University), and Jackson State 17 University; and

18 WHEREAS, while in college, he met the beautiful 19 Bettye Burson, who was attending Howard University and would 20 later become Miss Alabama; they eventually married, and he 21 remained faithfully devoted to her for 72 years, until her 22 death in March of 2024; and

23 WHEREAS, following college graduation, Johnny Howell 24 became an educator, coach, and principal; over the next 30 25 years he worked tirelessly, and he made a significant and 26 tangible impact on thousands of students and their families 27 in the greater Birmingham area; he served as head coach at 28 Woodlawn High School, as principal at Banks High School, as

the first principal of Vestavia Hills High School, and finally, as principal at Pinson Valley High School; beloved by all, he was often approached in public by individuals wanting to shake his hand or sit down to talk for a moment, and he always took time for them; and

34 WHEREAS, Johnny and Bettye Howell retired in the 35 Cumberland Lake community in the Pinson area, just outside 36 of Birmingham; he was happiest when surrounded by his large 37 family and many friends, and he spent many enjoyable hours 38 on the golf course; and

39 WHEREAS, Johnny Howell lived a life dedicated to 40 improving the well-being of others; he was an active and 41 driving force in charitable work and scholarship efforts for 42 young students; and

WHEREAS, Johnny Howell is preceded in death by his
beloved wife, Bettye Burson Howell; parents, Edith C. Farmer
(William A. Farmer) and Hollis B. "Hank" Howell (Eleanor R.
Howell); and brothers, Bill Farmer and Robert Farmer; and
