Lampley, a 11 hard-working farmer with whom she faithfully partnered in 12 13 running a substantial agricultural operation in Brundidge, Alabama, despite her own formal education concluding in the 14 15 ninth grade; and WHEREAS, Mrs. Lampley, a mother of eleven children, 16 raised her family with deep moral conviction, purpose, and 17 diligence, inspiring in them the values of hard work, 18 perseverance, and education; and 19 WHEREAS, from these humble and honorable roots grew a 20 21 family tree abundant with Tuskegee University alumni and 22 professionals who have excelled across fields of agriculture, education, military service, health care, 23 24 engineering, and public service; and 25 WHEREAS, her children include Jessie D. 45 WHEREAS, her grandchildren continue the tradition of 46 excellence through Tuskegee University including grandson, Gary Ward, USDA officer; Candace Ward McCoy, occupational 47 therapist; Jonathan Lampley, district ranger; Whitney 48 49 Tillman, attorney; and Stephanie Lampley Daniels, U.S. 50 Department of Veterans Affairs RN; her daughter-in-law, Delinda Shannon Lampley, also a Tuskegee alumna, has served 51 52 with Alabama Medicaid for over 25 years; and
