5	OCCASION OF HIS RETIREMENT AFTER NEARLY 30 YEARS OF
6	DEDICATED SERVICE TO THE BIRMINGHAM POLICE DEPARTMENT.

8	WHEREAS, the integrity, professionalism, and
9	commitment of law enforcement officers play a critical role
10	in maintaining public safety, fostering community trust, and
11	upholding justice; and
12	WHEREAS, Captain Torry Mack has exemplified these
13	qualities throughout his distinguished career, serving the
14	Birmingham Police Department with unwavering dedication
15	since June 1995; and
16	WHEREAS, Captain Mack's leadership as Special
17	Enforcement Division Commander from July 2020 to present
18	guided 84 specialized personnel across critical units,
19	including Vice and Narcotics, Tactical Operations, Crime
20	Reduction Team (CRT), Special Enforcement Team (SET), Motor
21	Scouts, Crime Suppression, Explosive Ordinance Disposal
22	(EOD), K-9, and Task Force Officers assigned to state and
23	federal agencies; and
24	WHEREAS, his command of multi-agency task forces,
25	partnerships with local, state, federal, and international
26	law enforcement agencies, and strategic oversight of
27	high-risk operations ensured effective crime suppression and
28	intelligence coordination, significantly disrupting criminal

29 networks in Birmingham; and

30 WHEREAS, his expertise in undercover operations, 31 narcotics investigations, surveillance coordination, and 32 task force management demonstrated a commitment to 33 innovative and ethical policing strategies, contributing to 34 substantial crime reduction; and

35 WHEREAS, as Director of the Birmingham Police Academy 36 from May 2018 to July 2020, Captain Mack shaped law enforcement education, overseeing the training and 37 38 professional development of new recruits and seasoned officers, implementing curricula on procedural justice, 39 implicit bias, and community policing, and facilitating 40 41 strategic partnerships with universities to expand officer 42 education pathways; and

WHEREAS, during his tenure as Training Coordinator
from June 2011 to May 2018, Captain Mack supervised training
for approximately 850 sworn personnel annually, ensuring
officer readiness and compliance with Alabama Peace
Officers' Standards and Training Commission (APOSTC) and
Commission on Accreditation for Law Enforcement Agencies
(CALEA) standards; and

50 WHEREAS, his role in fostering trust within 51 Birmingham's diverse communities included launching Being 52 Bilingual on the Beat, a Spanish-language program to enhance 53 officer engagement within the Hispanic community; and

54 WHEREAS, his service as an Officer in the Tactical 55 Operations Unit from December 1999 to June 2011 included 56 leadership as the Lead Instructor for Basic and Advanced

57 Special Weapons and Tactics (SWAT) School, conducting 58 high-risk operations, hostage negotiations, and dignitary protection details, securing routes for the U.S. Secret 59 60 Service and presidential escorts, and providing plain 61 clothes security for high-profile dignitaries; and 62 WHEREAS, Captain Mack's distinguished career also 63 included service in the Patrol Bureau, demonstrating 64 frontline commitment to public safety, rapid response, and proactive crime prevention from June 1995 to December 1999; 65
