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4	HR DESIGNATING THE RECIPIENT OF THE 2025 SHROUD AWARD.
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6	WHEREAS, there are several world-famous automobile
7	races that take place this time of year, the Talladega 500,
8	the Indianapolis 500, the Formula 1 Grand Prix of Monaco,
9	and the 24 Hours of Le Mans; to win any of those races is
10	the culmination of a dream; and
11	WHEREAS, today, we announce another race, which, if
12	won, will be the culmination of shattered dreams and good
13	intentions; ladies and gentlemen, I give you "The Goat Hill
14	105," otherwise known as The Shroud Award; more than 600
15	bills make up the field for today's race, but in the end,
16	only a handful of these finely crafted pieces of Alabama
17	designed and built legislation will be in contention for the
18	Earl Mitchell Memorial Plaque, named after the former
19	representative and father of The Shroud Award who managed a
20	funeral home in Northport; and
21	WHEREAS, I see Speaker Nathaniel Ledbetter has
22	finished assigning bills to committee and is reaching for
23	the Green Flag; the bills are picking up speed coming down
24	the Union Street straight; the Speaker is waving the Green
25	Flag; and we are racing at Goat Hill; and
26	WHEREAS, it looks like all the bills have gotten off
27	to a clean start; they're heading into turn one at
28	Washington Avenue, better known as Committee Corner, and are

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29	approaching the New State House roundabout; and there's
30	already trouble on the track; the yellow flag is out, and
31	smoke is pouring from the back of House Bill 489, the "Show
32	Me the Money Special," driven by Smiling Jeremy Gray; this
33	bill would have brought the Name-Image-Likeness program that
34	has been so highly successful at the college level (just ask
35	Nick Saban) to high school athletes all across the Great
36	State of Alabama; Representative Gray's bill was extremely
37	easy to spot in this pack of legislation; in fact, with all
38	of the colorful corporate sponsor stickers you could barely
39	see the bill number; the only sponsor he didn't have was
40	STP, which might have kept his bill from blowing up only a
41	quarter of a lap into the race; the well-liked
42	representative from Lee and Russell counties is waving to
43	the crowd and walking back to the pits; no doubt he'll be
4 4	back in the running next year; the clean-up crews have taken
45	care of the oil dropped by House Bill 489, and we're back to
46	green flag racing; and
47	WHEREAS, twenty-five laps have been completed and the
48	first bill coming in for a scheduled pit stop is House Bill
49	277, the Bonnie and Clyde Special, driven by Swervin' Ernie
50	Yarbrough of Trinity; Representative Yarbrough's bill would
51	have created a Second Amendment tax holiday for guns,
52	ammunition, and hunting supplies and would be scheduled at a
53	time between Memorial Day and the Fourth of July; the fiscal
54	note on the bill suggested there would be little if any
55	impact on state revenue since most gun owners in Alabama
56	already have enough weapons and ammunition to fight World

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57	Wars III, IV, and V; Yarbrough's pit crew has finished
58	putting on four new "Bad Year" tires and topped the bill off
59	with 18 gallons of "Goat Hill Go Juice"; the jacks are down
60	and Yarbrough "guns" his engine (you should pardon the pun),
61	and his bill stalls; his crew is trying to push him off, but
62	that bill looks to be as dead as Elmer Fudd's chances of
63	shooting Bugs Bunny; and
64	WHEREAS, back to the race; we're now 60 laps into
65	this 105-lap thriller and there have been several lead
66	changes; wait a minute - the officials are showing a black
67	flag to a bill that doesn't have a number; officials are
68	surrounding the bill as it comes to a stop in the pits;
69	there's quite a commotion going on, and they're impounding
70	the bill; a race official has noticed something on the side
71	of that bill; he's pulling off what appears to be duct tape;
72	and on the side of that bill are the words "Snake Eyes"; the
73	driver is a state senator; it's Greg "They Don't Call Me
74	Dick Dastardly For Nothing" Albritton; Albritton tried to
75	sneak a gambling bill into the final laps of this race; is
76	there no limit to how low the Alabama Senate will stoop;
77	what a race this has been and we're rapidly approaching the
78	end; and
79	WHEREAS, the bills are coming out of the tri-oval at
80	Monroe Street and are headed to the line, it's going to be
81	close; it's going to be very close; Speaker Ledbetter waves
82	the checkered flag; and the winner of the first Goat Hill
83	105 is House Bill 18, "The Strap 'Em Down and Buckle 'Em Up

85 Bolton's bill would have revised the weight and age ranges 86 for determining the appropriate child passenger restraint 87 system parents would be required to use in their vehicles; 88 as with the other two House bills, there's no question of 89 Representative Bolton's good intentions, but to say this bill was complicated is being kind; while Representatives 90 91 Gray and Yarbrough's bills were fairly straightforward, 92 Representative Bolton's bill read like chapters from a 93 pediatrician's anatomy book or an instruction manual on how 94 to operate a nuclear reactor; opposition to the bill came 95 from both sides of the aisle; when Representative Terry 96 Collins and Representative Adline Clarke team up against 97 you, it's a sure bet that things aren't going to end well; 98 and 99 WHEREAS, the main concern of opponents centered on the bill being a "one size fits all" fix when "one size fits 100 all" rarely, if ever, applies to children or House members; 101 102 and let's not forget what Representative Marcus Paramore pointed out just before the BIR failed; this bill would have 103 made it impossible for him, Representative Leigh Hulsey, and 104 105 Representative Susan DuBose to drive themselves to work; can 106 you picture Leigh Hulsey sitting in a child restraint device; if the gentleman from Northport is open to 107 108 suggestions, his proposal might stand a better chance next 109 year if he takes a page from NASCAR's safety requirements; simply mandate children wear a helmet and a HANS device and 110 111 be strapped in with a five-point locking harness; the legislation goes from a five-page bill to a two-page bill -112
