7 WHEREAS, it is with profound sorrow that we note the 8 death on December 11, 2024, of Dr. Stanley Allen "Stan" 9 Torain II of Huntsville, Alabama, at the age of 46; his 10 passing leaves a void in the lives of his loving family, 11 many friends, and the community where he was highly 12 regarded; and

13 WHEREAS, a native of Huntsville, Stan Torain was born 14 to the union of Doris Faye Torain and Stanley Allen Torain, 15 Sr.; his parents ensured that he was active in church, and 16 at 12 years of age, he sang his first song at New Jerusalem 17 Missionary Baptist Church entitled, "Ain't that Good News"; 18 and

19 WHEREAS, Stan Torain earned a Bachelor of Science in 20 Instrumental Music and a Master of Education in Secondary 21 Education from Alabama A&M University; always seeking to 22 learn more about the gospel, he went on to earn his Doctor 23 of Theology from the University of Minnesota Graduate School 24 and the O.L. 25 WHEREAS, he was a faithful member of Fountain of Life 26 Ministries Church of God in Christ for more than 20 years; 27 he served in many capacities, including ordination as an 28 Elder, Praise and Worship Leader, Men's Department

31 WHEREAS, in 2021, seeking to serve the Lord and his 32 community in an even greater capacity, he endeavored to 33 serve as the Praise and Worship Leader at Progressive Union 34 Missionary Baptist Church while simultaneously serving in 35 his local church; and

36 WHEREAS, additionally, Dr. Torain was actively 37 involved in the music department of the Huntsville District 38 Church of God in Christ where he served for several years as 39 the District Praise and Worship Leader; in 2023, he was 40 installed as President of the District Worship and Arts 41 Department; and

WHEREAS, throughout his life, Stan Torain was an intricate part of many different musical groups; he was a member of the gospel recording group, James Strong & Message, the Huntsville Mass Choir, and the Instruments of Praise; in September 2007, he was called to begin a music group named Continual Praise, whose name comes directly from Hebrews 13:15; and

WHEREAS, Dr. Torain was a passionate and skilled Music Educator; he served the community as Band Director for Choctaw County High, R.A. Hubbard K-12, and most recently, Huntsville Junior High School; his love for music and dedication to his students endeared him to all; and
