7 WHEREAS, highest commendations are extended to 8 Mildred S. Woods for being recognized as a Willie and Betty 9 Farrior Family Foundation Honoree for her many contributions 10 to her community; and

11 WHEREAS, the foundation is named in honor of Willie 12 Farrior, the first African American hired by the Alabama 13 Institute for Deaf and Blind (AIDB) and the first African 14 American to be recognized as Blind Worker of the Year in 15 1973; in 1974, he was promoted to training instructor and 16 became the first Black assistant supervisor for AIDB in 17 1979; in 2017, the foundation was established by his 18 daughter, Mary Louise Farrior-White and grandson, Retired 19 Colonel Cedrick A. Farrior; the foundation recognizes certain individuals who have selflessly contributed their 20 21 time for the betterment of their community; and

22 WHEREAS, Mildred S. Woods is a retired educator from 23 the Talladega City School System as a special education 24 teacher, reading and math teacher, adult education teacher 25 with the Federal Correctional Institute, Central Alabama 26 Community College, Talladega College, Sharp Dean School of 27 Continuing Education, Green Christian Academy, and Youth 28 Conservation Corp; Mildred is a member of Peace Baptist

Wilson Scholarship Fund Committee, and organizer of the Youth Development Organization; and
