7 WHEREAS, the State of Alabama and the Nation of Japan 8 are established partners in the global economy, with mutual 9 trade in 2022 between Alabama and Japan reaching nearly \$2 10 billion, including mineral fuel, aircraft, spacecraft, 11 vehicles, wood pulp, paper, organic and inorganic chemicals, 12 machinery, computers, vehicles, media equipment, ammunition, 13 pharmaceuticals, and financial services; and

14 WHEREAS, Japanese companies have invested over \$20 billion in Alabama, making Japan the number one foreign 15 direct investor in the state; 20,000 jobs have been created 16 in Alabama, including 8,100 jobs since 2018, by investment 17 from Japanese companies, which include Honda Manufacturing 18 of Alabama, Mazda Toyota Manufacturing USA, Incorporated, 19 Protective Life, Toyota Motor Manufacturing, Alabama, 20 21 Incorporated, Rheem Manufacturing Company, and Daikin 22 America, Incorporated; and

23 WHEREAS, in addition to being a regional ally, Japan 24 is a key partner of the United States on the international 25 stage, collaborating with our nation in many critical areas 26 that include global security, development assistance, 27 environmental protection, new energy technologies, 28 supercomputing, critical materials, and space; and

WHEREAS, students at Alabama universities and colleges have been enriched by visits to Japan for study, including students from Birmingham-Southern College, Samford University, University of West Alabama, The University of Alabama at Birmingham, The University of Alabama, Auburn University, The University of Alabama in Huntsville, Troy University, Talladega College, and Miles College; and

36 WHEREAS, the people of Alabama and Japan have enjoyed 37 rich and rewarding friendships and cultural exchange through 38 sister-city relationships, including Birmingham-Hitachi, Anniston-Tatsuno, Tuscaloosa-Narachino, Dothan-Sakado, 39 Mobile-Ichara, Montevallo-Echizen, and Birmingham-Maebashi; 40 41 the Japanese Garden in the Birmingham Botanical Gardens is 42 recognized by the government of Japan as an official 43 Japanese Cultural Center, and many Alabamians take a lively 44 interest in Japanese culture through organizations such as 45 Bonsai and garden societies, exhibitions, events such as the 46 Sakura festival in Tuscaloosa, and the Japan-America Society of Alabama; now therefore, 47
