4	SYNOPSIS:
5	This bill would establish the crime of
6	interference with a first responder when after
7	receiving a lawful order to not interfere with the
8	performance of a first responder's duties, the person
9	approaches or remains within 25 feet of the first
10	responder and impedes, threatens, or otherwise harasses
11	the first responder.

15	TO BE ENTITLED
16	AN ACT

18	Relating to crimes and offenes; to add Section
19	13A-10-2.1 to the Code of Alabama 1975, and to amend Section
20	13A-10-1, Code of Alabama 1975, to establish the crime of
21	interference with a first responder; and to provide criminal
22	penalties for a violation.
23	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:
24	Section 1. Section 13A-10-2.1 is added to the Code of
25	Alabama 1975, to read as follows:
26	§13A-10-2.1
27	(a) A person commits the crime of interference with a
28	first responder if the person approaches or remains within 25



- 29 feet of any first responder engaged in a lawful government
- 30 function after the first responder has instructed the person
- not to approach or to vacate the area and the person does any
- 32 of the following:
- 33 (1) Impedes or interferes with the first responder's
- 34 ability to perform his or her duties.
- 35 (2) Threatens the first responder with physical harm.
- 36 (3) Strikes, shoves, kicks, or otherwise touches the
- 37 first responder, or subjects the first responder to physical
- 38 contact.
- 39 (b) Interference with a first responder is a Class A
- 40 misdemeanor.
- 41 (c) This section does not apply to the obstruction,
- 42 impairment, or hindrance of the making of an arrest.
- Section 2. Section 13A-10-1, Code of Alabama 1975, is
- 44 amended to read as follows:
- 45 "\$13A-10-1
- The following definitions apply in this article only
- 47 unless the context otherwise requires:
- 48 (1) FIREMAN or FIREFIGHTER. Any officer of a fire
- department, a member of a volunteer fire department, or any
- other person vested by law with the duty to extinguish fires.
- 51 (2) FIRST RESPONDER. The term as defined under Section
- 52 11-98-1.
- $\frac{(2)}{(3)}$  GOVERNMENT. The state, county, municipality, or
- other political subdivision thereof, including public county
- and city boards of education, the youth services department
- district, the Alabama Institute for Deaf and Blind, and all



- educational institutions under the auspices of the State Board
- of Education.
- $\frac{(3)}{(4)}$  GOVERNMENTAL FUNCTION. Any activity which a
- 60 public servant is legally authorized to undertake on behalf of
- a government or the fire control activities of a member of a
- 62 volunteer fire department.
- (4) (5) GOVERNMENTAL RECORD. Any record, paper,
- document, or thing belonging to, or received or kept by, the
- 65 government for information or record, or required by law to be
- 66 kept by others for information of the government. Any
- 67 educational attendance, membership, or financial report, or a
- 68 student's school transcript.
- (5) (6) PEACE OFFICER. Any public servant vested by law
- 70 with a duty to maintain public order or to make arrests for
- 71 crime, whether that duty extends to all crimes or is limited
- 72 to specific crimes.
- 73  $\frac{(6)}{(7)}$  PROPERTY. Any real or personal property,
- 74 including books, records, and documents.
- 75 (7) (8) PUBLIC SERVANT. Any officer or employee of the
- 76 government, including legislators and judges and any person or
- agency participating as an adviser, consultant, or otherwise
- 78 in performing a governmental function."
- 79 Section 3. This act shall become effective on October
- 80 1, 2025.
