

## SYNOPSIS:

Under existing law, termination dates are established for enumerated state agencies. The agencies are periodically reviewed by the Alabama Sunset Committee. After the review process is completed, the committee prepares its recommendation for the agencies to the Legislature in the form of sunset bills which either continue, terminate, or continue with modification each agency reviewed.

This bill would provide for the continuance of the State Board of Podiatry until October 1, 2029, with the following change: To require that a board member resides in and be appointed from each congressional district in this state.

Relating to the Alabama Sunset Law; to continue the existence and functioning of the State Board of Podiatry until October 1, 2029, with certain modifications; to amend Section 34-24-250, Code of Alabama 1975, to require that a board member resides in and be appointed from each congressional



- 29 district in this state.
- 30 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:
- 31 Section 1. Pursuant to the Alabama Sunset Law, the
- 32 Sunset Committee recommends the continuance of the State Board
- of Podiatry until October 1, 2029, with additional
- 34 recommendation for statutory change as set out in Section 3.
- 35 Section 2. The existence and functioning of the State
- 36 Board of Podiatry, created and functioning pursuant to
- 37 Sections 34-24-230 to 34-24-276, inclusive, Code of Alabama
- 38 1975, is continued until October 1, 2029, and those code
- 39 sections are expressly preserved.
- Section 3. Section 34-24-250, Code of Alabama 1975, is
- 41 amended to read as follows:
- 42 "\$34-24-250
- 43 (a) The Governor of Alabama shall appoint a State Board
- 44 of Podiatry consisting of seven persons individuals, each of
- 45 whom shall be a citizen of the United States and a resident of
- 46 Alabama, over the age of 25, and shall have been engaged in
- 47 the actual continuous practice of podiatry in the State of
- 48 Alabama for at least five years next preceding his or her
- 49 appointment. One member of the board shall be appointed each
- year, with the exception of three members being appointed
- every fifth year starting in 1979, for terms of five years and
- 52 until their successors are appointed and qualified. No member
- of the board shall be reappointed for a successive term.
- 54 Previous board members are eligible for nonsuccessive
- 55 appointments. The Governor may remove from office at any time
- any member of the board for neglect of duty, incompetency,



- 57 improper or unprofessional conduct, or when the license or
- 58 certificate of any member has been suspended or revoked.
- Vacancies on the board shall be filled by appointment by the
- 60 Governor in the manner provided in this section. The Governor
- shall furnish each member of the board at the time of
- 62 appointment a certificate of appointment, and the appointee
- shall qualify by taking the usual oath of office before the
- judge of probate of his or her home county within 15 days from
- 65 the date of appointment.
- 66 (b) After April 6, 1993, each vacant office occurring
- shall be first offered to each available black licensee until
- a black member is appointed to the board. When a black member
- is appointed to the board, thereafter appointments shall be
- 70 made in such a manner as to ensure at least one black member
- on the board at all times, and the membership of the board
- 72 shall be inclusive and reflect the racial, gender, geographic,
- 73 urban/rural urban, rural, and economic diversity of the state.
- 74 Commencing on June 1, 2025, as the terms of the members
- 75 serving on the board expire, the membership of the board shall
- 76 be appointed so that one member resides in and is appointed
- from each congressional district in this state."
- 78 Section 4. The Legislature concurs in the
- 79 recommendation of the Sunset Committee as provided in Sections
- 80 1, 2, and 3.
- Section 5. This act shall become effective on June 1,
- 82 2025.
