- 10 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:
- 11 Section 1. Section 31-14-3, Code of Alabama 1975, is
- 12 amended to read as follows:
- 13 "\$31-14-3
- 14 (a) The Alabama Job Creation and Military Stability
- 15 Commission is created. Members of the commission shall include
- 16 a chair and two vice chairs. The chair shall be the Lieutenant
- 17 Governor, or in the absence of a Lieutenant Governor, the
- 18 chair shall be the Governor, or his or her designee. The vice
- 19 chairs shall be the President Pro Tempore of the Senate, or
- 20 his or her designee, and the Speaker of the House of
- 21 Representatives, or his or her designee.
- 22 (b) The commission shall also consist of the following
- 23 members:
- 24 (1) Two members of the House of Representatives
- appointed by the Speaker of the House of Representatives.
- 26 (2) Two members of the Senate appointed by the
- 27 President Pro Tempore of the Senate.
- 28 (3) The Adjutant General of the Alabama National Guard.

- (5) The Secretary of the Department of Commerce.
- 32 (6) The Director of the Alabama Department of Economic 33 and Community Affairs.
- 34 (7) The Commissioner of the Alabama Department of 35 Veterans Affairs.

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- 36 (8) One senator from the minority caucus appointed by the Lieutenant Governor.
- 38 (9) One representative from the minority caucus 39 appointed by the Speaker of the House of Representatives.
- 40 (10) The chair of the Alabama House Military and
 41 Veterans Affairs Committee.
- 42 (11) The chair of the Alabama Senate Veterans, Military
 43 Affairs, and Public Safety Committee.
 - (10) (12) One retired senior member of the Armed Forces for each of the five major military facilities in Alabama, Redstone Arsenal, Anniston Army Depot, Maxwell Air Force Base including the Gunter Annex, Fort Moore, and Fort Novosel who shall be appointed by the Governor, after consultation with the individual designated in subdivision (11)(13) as the civic leader from the community which the senior member of the military shall represent.
 - (11) (13) One civic leader with significant experience in military relocations from each of the five communities currently impacted most significantly by the presence of military facilities and assigned personnel who shall be appointed by the chair after consultation with the existing



organizations described in subsection (h).

- (c) Members of the commission shall serve for a term of four years with each appointment, may be reappointed for an unlimited number of terms, and shall serve on the commission until a replacement is appointed.
- (d) The members of the Alabama Job Creation and Military Stability Commission created by Act 2011-350, as amended by Act 2013-156, shall be the initial members of the commission created under this section and shall continue to serve on the commission at the pleasure of the appointing authority until the quadrennium commencing in 2019. Persons appointed after the commencement of the quadrennium commencing in 2019 commission shall serve a term of four years.
- (e) The commission shall hold its organizational meeting by August 31, 2017. Thereafter, the commission shall meet at the call of the chair; provided, that the commission shall meet at least once annually.
- (f) The commission shall adopt rules for its governance, including, but not limited to, the filling of vacancies, the election of officers, the creation of committees, including an executive committee, and the execution of documents. Members of the commission, the executive committee of the commission, or any other committee established by the commission may participate in a meeting of the commission or committee by means of telephone conference, video conference, or using similar communications methods by means of which all individuals participating in the meeting may hear one another. Participation by such means shall



85 constitute presence in person at a meeting for all purposes, 86 including for purposes of establishing a quorum. Notice of 87 meetings shall be provided in accordance with the Alabama Open 88 Meetings Act and similar means of communication be allowed to provide for members of the public to listen and observe 89 90

meetinas.

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- (g) The Secretary of the Senate, the Clerk of the House of Representatives, the Legislative Services Agency, Legal Division, the Legislative Services Agency, Fiscal Division, and the Examiners of Public Accounts shall provide assistance as requested by the commission. Each legislative member of the commission and supporting staff shall be entitled to his or her regular legislative compensation and his or her per diem and travel expenses for each day he or she attends a meeting of the commission which shall be paid out of any funds appropriated for the use of the Legislature, upon warrants drawn on the Comptroller upon requisition signed by the commission's chair. Members shall not receive additional legislative compensation or per diem when the Legislature is in session but shall receive his or her travel expenses for all meetings attended.
- (h) The commission shall make proactive attempts to ensure the stability of Alabama-assigned Department of Defense resources by the study and evaluation of military organizations, personnel, civilian support personnel, equipment, and infrastructure currently located in the state, and the re-stationing or reorganization of military resources located in, relocating to, or outside of the state using the



- 113 following items of evaluation:
- 114 (1) All Department of Defense personnel, assets, and
 115 equipment, including that belonging to the Alabama National
 116 Guard and Reserve units or forces.
- 117 (2) The economic impact of these resources on surrounding communities.
- 119 (3) Current policies, programs, and services that
 120 impact Department of Defense resources located in the state.
- 121 (4) The impact these Department of Defense assets and 122 resources have on state and local job creation.
- 123 (5) The impact of Department of Defense assets and 124 resources on local businesses and industry.
- 125 (6) Funding available or required to promote the 126 sustained presence of Department of Defense assets and 127 resources appropriated to the state.
- 128 (i) The commission shall not alter the purpose,

 129 replace, or change the role of any existing organization, task

 130 force, or committee within a military community with the


 131 purpose of promoting military growth, including Base Closure

 132 and Realignment Commission associated actions.
- (j) The appointing authorities of the commission shall coordinate their appointments to assure the membership of the Alabama Job Creation and Military Stability Commission is inclusive and reflects the racial, gender, geographic, urban, rural, and economic diversity of the state.
- 138 (k) The commission shall make an annual report to
 139 members of the Legislature no later than the seventh
 140 legislative day of each regular session beginning in 2018





- 141 detailing all commission activities and recommendations.
- 142 (1) The commission may accept gifts, contributions,
- 143 bequests, grants, and other donations, whether public or
- 144 private, of money, real property, or personal property and
- shall expend the same in furtherance of the work of the
- 146 commission.
- 147 (m) The work of the commission shall be supported by
- 148 the Military Stability Foundation, an Alabama nonprofit
- 149 corporation incorporated on September 8, 2011, which shall not
- 150 be considered a government body. Documents produced by or for
- 151 the foundation shall not be considered public writings, even
- if viewed by or delivered to the commission, as the disclosure
- of the documents would be detrimental to the best interest of
- 154 the public."
- Section 2. This act shall become effective on October
- 156 1, 2025.
