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4 To make supplemental appropriations for the fiscal year

5 ending September 30, 2025, from the Education Trust Fund to

6 various agencies and entities in a total amount of

41 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:

42 Section 1. In addition to all other appropriations
43 heretofore or hereafter made, there is hereby appropriated a
44 total of \$524,276,588 from the Education Trust Fund to the
45 following agencies and entities for the purposes specified
46 below for the fiscal year ending September 30, 2025:

47 (1) To the State Board of Education - Local Boards of
48 Education, \$28,000,000 to be used for textbook adoption

49 (2) To the State Department of Education for one-time
50 expenses, \$136,029,000. Of this amount, \$16,000,000 shall be
51 for Ed Farm to be used for capital outlay, startup operations,
52 and for the deployment of broadband internet infrastructure in
53 rural communities supporting digital career technical
54 education programs, online learning, certifications, and job
55 placement assistance in technology fields; \$2,500,000 shall be
56 used for the Alabama Council of Emergency Medical Services for



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57 one-time expenses related to automatic external defibrillators
58 (AEDs) in schools, including purchase, maintenance, training
59 and education, equipment, operations and management; \$250,000
60 shall be used for the Alabama Holocaust Commission for teacher
61 training; \$15,000,000 shall be for School Safety to provide
62 additional training, services, supplies, and materials to
63 support school safety initiatives and safety contracts to be
64 allocated pursuant to Chapter 22B, Title 16, Code of Alabama
65 1975, including \$3,000,000 for School Mapping; \$10,000,000
66 shall be used for College and Career Readiness Grants; \$90,000
67 shall be used by the Chambers County Board of Education for
68 the Chambers County High School culinary facility electrical
69 wiring; \$10,300,000 shall be used for Charter School Grants
70 which shall be distributed to the several existing conversion
71 and start-up charter schools that are physically located in a
72 school system with a B, C, D, or F as defined by the Alabama
73 Education Report Card, Chapter 6C, Title 16, Code of Alabama
74 1975, on a per pupil basis; \$1,100,000 shall be used for the
75 CREATE Technology and Innovation Center to include providing
76 dual enrollment scholarships through Gadsden State Community
77 College; \$150,000 shall be used for the Dandrill Heights Film
78 Camp for students; \$5,000,000 shall be used for the Heman
79 Drummond Center for Innovation; \$100,000 shall be used for
80 the Jazz Hall of Fame statewide students programs; \$10,000,000
81 shall be used for Principal and Assistant Principal
82 Supplements to cover current obligations; \$7,300,000 shall be
83 used for the School Breakfast Program; \$350,000 shall be used
84 for Speech Pathologists to cover current obligations;



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85 \$30,000,000 shall be used for the Summer and Afterschool
86 Program; \$10,000,000 shall be used for Struggling Readers
87 Beyond Grade 3 to support middle grade reading improvements;
88 \$3,464,000 shall be used for the American Village to be
89 allocated to the Semiquincentennial Commission for the
90 Semiquincentennial School Program, Community Engagement
91 Grants, Marketing and Communication, Honoring Veterans, and
92 Administration Costs; \$9,500,000 shall be used for the North
93 Alabama STEM Center, in support of mathematics and science
94 goals established by the Department of Education; \$1,250,000
95 shall be used for the Prisms Math Pilot Project; \$125,000
96 shall be used for the Learning Disabilities Institute/Spring
97 Valley; \$200,000 shall be used for Perry County Schools for
98 capital improvements; \$1,000,000 shall be used for the
99 Statewide Student Assessment; \$150,000 shall be used for the
100 Alabama Wildlife Federation for the Alabama Outdoor Classroom
101 Program; \$700,000 shall be used for the Wooley Institute for
102 Spoken Language Education; and \$1,500,000 shall be used to
103 begin the development of a course in United States History,
104 Government, and/or Civics aligned to the Alabama Course of
105 Study: Social Studies, to be offered to all preK-12 teachers
106 in an online format. The Department shall consult with
107 organizations and agencies which can lend aid to this project,
108 including American Village and Alabama Public Television.

109 (3) To the Educational Television Commission
110 \$4,120,000. Of this amount, \$4,000,000 shall be used for the
111 Madison Avenue Studio and new State House Studio; and \$120,000
112 shall be used for semiquincentennial programming.



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113 (4) To the Council on the Arts, \$5,380,000. Of this
114 amount, \$1,000,000 shall be used for one-time expenses for
115 deferred maintenance, renovation of existing facilities, or
116 expenses associated with ongoing capital projects at the
117 Shakespeare Festival; \$100,000 shall be used for a
118 collaborative community outreach program at the Shakespeare
119 Festival with the Alabama Center for the Arts; \$90,000 shall
120 be used for the Alabama Symphony Orchestra; \$1,000,000 shall
121 be used for capital expenses for the Carnegie Visual Arts
122 Museum expansion; \$750,000 shall be used for the Southeast
123 Alabama Community Theatre; and \$2,440,000 shall be used for
124 the facilities grant program, including \$200,000 for the
125 Student Art Program. The Council of the Arts may award grants
126 from the facilities grant program for projects that build,
127 renovate, restore, preserve, or enhance arts facilities in
128 Alabama, including performing arts centers, art museums and
129 galleries, multi-purpose arts centers, artist residency
130 facilities, and outdoor performance venues. The Council of the
131 Arts shall emphasize rural assistance with grants, with a
132 preference for entities not receiving grants in the prior
133 year. Eligible entities include: (i) 501(c) (3) nonprofit arts
134 organizations chartered in Alabama, active and in good
135 standing with the Internal Revenue Service and the council; or
136 (ii) an entity of local government. Grant amounts shall not
137 exceed \$100,000 to any one entity, with the first four grants
138 being reserved for the Wetumpka Depot Theatre, the Kelly
139 Fitzpatrick Center, the Arts Council of the Trussville Area,
140 and the Burleson Fine Arts Center.



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141 (5) To the Music Hall of Fame, \$250,000.

142 (6) To the Public Library Service for the Supreme Court
143 Law Library, \$200,000.

144 (7) To the Alabama Department of Revenue, \$50,513,000,
145 estimated. Of this amount, \$50,000,000, estimated, shall be
146 distributed to the CHOOSE Act Fund established by Act 2024-21
147 of the 2024 Regular Session of the Legislature for the purpose
148 of funding Education Savings Accounts; and \$513,000 shall be
149 used for the Education Savings Account administration.

150 (8) To the Alabama Supercomputer Authority, \$2,000,000.
151 Of this amount, \$1,400,000 shall be used for the Data Center
152 Renovation Project and \$600,000 shall be used for the FCC K-12
153 Cybersecurity Pilot Project - ASA Match.

154 (9) To the Department of Workforce for a state veterans
155 transition public/private partnership that will provide
156 comprehensive support to include career transition and
157 education and community integration, \$5,000,000.

158 (10) To the Alabama School of Cyber Technology and
159 Engineering for one-time expenses for deferred maintenance and
160 school safety, \$3,500,000.

161 (11) To the Alabama School of Fine Arts for one-time
162 expenses for deferred maintenance and school safety,
163 \$3,500,000.

164 (12) To the Alabama School of Mathematics and Science
165 for one-time expenses for dormitories, deferred maintenance
166 and school safety, \$3,500,000.

167 (13) To the Firefighters' Personnel Standards and
168 Education Commission/Fire College, \$4,300,000. Of this amount,



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169 \$600,000 shall be used for the Muscle Shoals Regional Training
170 Center Burn Building; \$3,100,000 shall be used for the EMT and
171 Testing Facility; and \$600,000 shall be used for one-time
172 expenses for deferred maintenance, renovation of existing
173 facilities, or expenses associated with ongoing capital
174 projects.

175 (14) To the Marine Environmental Sciences Consortium,
176 \$7,000,000. Of this amount, \$5,000,000 shall be used for the
177 new dormitory and \$2,000,000 shall be used for waterline
178 infrastructure improvements.

179 (15) To the Alabama Institute for Deaf and Blind,
180 \$2,000,000. Of this amount, \$150,000 shall be used for the
181 Short-Term Programs, and \$1,850,000 shall be used for one-time
182 expenses for deferred maintenance and school safety.

183 (16) To the Alabama Community College System,
184 \$55,811,836. Of this amount, \$28,861,836 shall be used for
185 one-time expenses for deferred maintenance, renovation of
186 existing facilities, or expenses associated with ongoing
187 capital projects; \$300,000 shall be used for ACCS women's
188 sports; \$2,000,000 shall be used for the Forestry Workforce
189 Training Center; \$1,100,000 shall be used for the Bishop State
190 Student Life Complex; \$3,200,000 shall be used for the Calhoun
191 Community College for the Culinary and Hospitality Program;
192 \$1,300,000 shall be used for the Coastal Alabama Community
193 College; \$2,500,000 shall be used for Enterprise Community
194 College GTech; \$3,000,000 shall be used for the Jefferson
195 State Community College for Jefferson campus renovations;
196 \$750,000 shall be used for the Lurleen B. Wallace Community



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197 College Skills for Success; \$5,200,000 shall be used for the
198 Medical Workforce Training Center with Huntsville Hospital;
199 \$500,000 shall be used for Northeast Alabama Community College
200 workforce development; \$1,000,000 shall be used for the
201 Northwest Shoals Community College for the Lauderdale County
202 Workforce Center; \$1,500,000 shall be used for Reid State
203 Technical College; \$1,100,000 shall be used for the Snead
204 State Community College Additive Manufacturing Program and
205 other projects; and \$3,500,000 shall be used for Wallace State
206 Community College-Hanceville facility improvements.

207 (17) To Alabama A&M University, \$6,222,688. Of this
208 amount, \$3,222,688 shall be used for one-time expenses for
209 deferred maintenance, renovation of existing facilities, or
210 expenses associated with ongoing capital projects; \$750,000
211 shall be used for campus security upgrades; \$250,000 shall be
212 used for the Miles College Masters in Sports Management; and
213 \$2,000,000 shall be used for campus infrastructure
214 improvements.

215 (18) To Alabama State University, \$4,180,844. Of this
216 amount, \$3,530,844 shall be used for one-time expenses for
217 deferred maintenance, renovation of existing facilities, or
218 expenses associated with ongoing capital projects; and
219 \$650,000 shall be used for the Prosthetics and Orthotics Lab
220 roof replacement.

221 (19) To the University of Alabama System, \$54,287,475.
222 Of this amount, \$42,087,475 shall be used for one-time
223 expenses for increasing research capacity, deferred
224 maintenance, renovation of existing facilities, or ongoing



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225 capital projects; \$12,000,000 shall be used for the Executive
226 Plaza Research Center; and \$200,000 shall be used for the NCAA
227 Volleyball Championship.

228 (20) To Athens State University, \$3,772,700. Of this
229 amount, \$3,022,700 shall be used for one-time expenses for
230 deferred maintenance, renovation of existing facilities, or
231 expenses associated with ongoing capital projects; \$250,000
232 shall be used for operations and maintenance; and \$500,000
233 shall be used for Carter Hall renovations.

234 (21) To Auburn University, \$26,067,000. Of this amount,
235 \$19,000,000 shall be used for one-time expenses for increasing
236 research infrastructure and instrumentation, technology
237 systems, deferred maintenance, renovation of existing
238 facilities, or ongoing capital projects; \$67,000 shall be used
239 for Livestock Judging; and \$7,000,000 shall be used for
240 Agricultural Experimental Stations.

241 (22) To Auburn University at Montgomery for one-time
242 expenses for deferred maintenance, renovation of existing
243 facilities, or expenses associated with ongoing capital
244 projects, \$3,262,202.

245 (23) To Jacksonville State University, \$5,632,743. Of
246 this amount, \$3,232,743 shall be used for one-time expenses
247 for deferred maintenance, renovation of existing facilities,
248 or expenses associated with ongoing capital projects; and
249 \$2,400,000 shall be used for the Energy Management Plan.

250 (24) To the University of Montevallo, \$4,028,237. Of
251 this amount, \$3,528,237 shall be used for one-time expenses
252 for deferred maintenance, renovation of existing facilities,



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253 or expenses associated with ongoing capital projects; and
254 \$500,000 shall be used residential facilities upgrades and
255 safety repairs.

256 (25) To the University of North Alabama, \$5,884,716. Of
257 this amount, \$1,599,716 shall be used for one-time expenses
258 for deferred maintenance, renovation of existing facilities,
259 or expenses associated with ongoing capital projects;
260 \$4,000,000 shall be used for the Engineering Building; and
261 \$285,000 shall be used for the Music Program.

262 (26) To the University of South Alabama, \$15,580,106.
263 Of this amount, \$11,080,106 shall be used for one-time
264 expenses for increasing research capacity, deferred
265 maintenance, renovation of existing facilities, or ongoing
266 capital projects; and \$4,500,000 shall be used for the USA
267 Police Department renovation, construction, and expansion
268 project.

269 (27) To Troy University, \$6,312,751. Of this amount,
270 \$4,612,751 shall be used for one-time expenses for deferred
271 maintenance, renovation of existing facilities, or expenses
272 associated with ongoing capital projects; \$475,000 shall be
273 used for health training equipment; and \$1,225,000 shall be
274 used for the School of Engineering.

275 (28) To the University of West Alabama, \$4,058,290. Of
276 this amount, \$3,058,290 shall be used for one-time expenses
277 for deferred maintenance, renovation of existing facilities,
278 or expenses associated with ongoing capital projects; \$900,000
279 shall be used for Wallace Hall; and \$100,000 shall be
280 transferred to Stillman College for cyber security.



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281 (29) To Tuskegee University, \$3,950,000. Of this
282 amount, \$3,000,000 shall be used for one-time expenses for
283 deferred maintenance, renovation of existing facilities,
284 school security, or expenses associated with ongoing capital
285 projects; \$450,000 shall be used for campus security
286 initiatives; and \$500,000 shall be used for the Kellog
287 Conference Center.

288 (30) To the Legislative Council for construction and
289 related expenses for the new State House, \$37,500,000.

290 (31) To the Lieutenant Governor to develop a plan and
291 solutions to improve workforce participation, \$350,000.

292 (32) To the Executive Commission on Community Services
293 Grants to be distributed pursuant to Section 29-2-123, Code of
294 Alabama 1975, \$10,300,000.

295 (33) To the Alabama Commission on Higher Education,
296 \$5,630,000. Of this amount, \$1,000,000 shall be used for the
297 Nature Discovery Center - Landtrust of North Alabama; \$900,000
298 shall be used for the North Alabama Agriplex; \$500,000 shall
299 be used for the Pathways to Progress; \$1,700,000 shall be used
300 for the Judge Horton Civil Justice Learning Center; \$1,200,000
301 shall be used for the Alabama Veterinary Hospital - Birmingham
302 Zoo; \$175,000 shall be used for the Tennessee Riverline
303 Program, for programs in Alabama only; \$80,000 shall be used
304 for Kingdom College; and \$75,000 shall be used for Selma
305 University.

306 (34) To the Alabama Historical Commission, \$7,575,000.
307 Of this amount, \$2,000,000 shall be used for the Daniel Pratt
308 Museum; \$2,000,000 shall be used for Clotilda Park; \$2,500,000



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309 shall be used for Fort Morgan restoration; \$175,000 shall be
310 used for Gees Bend Quilting Bee Cultural Preservation Center;
311 \$300,000 shall be used for the Operating Grant Program
312 pursuant to the provisions of Act 2024-351; \$100,000 shall be
313 used for the Cahaba Homestead Heritage Foundation; \$75,000
314 shall be used for the Jesse Owens Memorial; \$75,000 shall be
315 used for the City of Fairfield for the Willie Mays Park, in
316 collaboration with Major League Baseball; \$150,000 shall be
317 used for renovations to the Looney's Amphitheater Complex and
318 Cultural Center stage; and \$200,000 shall be used for Alabama
319 Constitution Village.

320 (35) To the Department of Human Resources, \$2,850,000.
321 Of this amount, \$850,000 shall be used for pregnancy resources
322 centers; and \$2,000,000 shall be used for the YMCA Greater
323 Birmingham Revitalization Project.

324 (36) To the Department of Public Health, \$1,578,000. Of
325 this amount, \$728,000 shall be used for Partnering in Alabama
326 Training and Healthcare (PATH); and \$850,000 shall be used for
327 the Regional Training Institute.

328 (37) To the Space Science Exhibit Commission for
329 one-time expenses for deferred maintenance, renovation of
330 existing facilities, or expenses associated with ongoing
331 capital projects, \$2,150,000.

332 (38) To the Alabama Innovation Fund for the Southern
333 Research Institute Innovation School, \$850,000.

334 (39) To the Department of Rehabilitation Services for
335 the Kulture City disability workforce center, \$500,000.

336 (40) To the Department of Early Childhood Education for



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337 Small Magic, \$400,000.

338 (41) To the Department of Youth Services for Coosa
339 Valley Youth Services, \$250,000.

340 Section 2. All funds appropriated herein and not
341 expended in the current fiscal year shall not revert but shall
342 be carried forward for the purpose appropriated.

343 Section 3. This act shall become effective immediately
344 upon its passage and approval by the Governor, or upon its
345 otherwise becoming law.
