5	This bill makes supplemental appropriations for
6	the fiscal year ending September 30, 2025, from the
7	Education Trust Fund to various agencies and entities
8	in a total amount of \$524,276,588.
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11	A BILL
12	TO BE ENTITLED
13	AN ACT
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15	To make supplemental appropriations for the fiscal year
16	ending September 30, 2025, from the Education Trust Fund to
17	various agencies and entities in a total amount of
18	\$524,276,588.
19	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:
20	Section 1. In addition to all other appropriations
21	heretofore or hereafter made, there is hereby appropriated a
22	total of \$524,276,588 from the Education Trust Fund to the
23	following agencies and entities for the purposes specified
24	below for the fiscal year ending September 30, 2025:
25	(1) To the State Board of Education - Local Boards of
26	Education, \$133,000,000. Of this amount, \$5,000,000 shall be
27	used for TEAMS to cover current contracts; \$28,000,000 shall
28	be used for textbook adoption; and \$100,000,000 shall be

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distributed according to the fleet renewal guidelines to be used for the purchase of school buses or the retirement of school bus debt. For any school system that is currently up to date in purchasing regular route buses, application may be made to the State Superintendent of Education to flex these funds for other educational purposes.

35 (2) To the State Department of Education for one-time 36 expenses, \$161,114,000. Of this amount, \$5,000,000 shall be 37 for Ed Farm to be used for capital outlay or other necessary expenses for a coding workforce training program; \$5,000,000 38 39 shall be used for AED's in Schools; \$50,000,000 shall be for School Safety to provide additional training, services, 40 supplies, and materials to support school safety initiatives 41 42 and safety contracts; \$20,000,000 shall be used for College 43 and Career Readiness Grants; \$10,300,000 shall be used for Charter School Grants which shall be distributed to the 44 45 several existing conversion and start-up charter schools on a 46 per pupil basis; \$5,000,000 shall be used for the Heman 47 Drummond Center for Innovation; \$14,000,000 shall be used for 48 Principal and Assistant Principal Supplements to cover current 49 obligations; \$350,000 shall be used for Speech Pathologists to 50 cover current obligations; \$30,000,000 shall be used for the 51 Summer and Afterschool Program; \$10,000,000 shall be used for Struggling Readers Beyond Grade 3 to support middle grade 52 53 reading improvements; \$3,464,000 shall be used for the 54 American Village Semiguincentennial Commission for the 55 Semiquincentennial School Program, Community Engagement 56 Grants, Marketing and Communication, Honoring Veterans, and

57 Administration Costs; \$7,500,000 shall be used for the North 58 Alabama STEM Center; and \$500,000 shall be used to begin the 59 development of a course in United States History, Government, 60 and/or Civics aligned to the Alabama Course of Study: Social Studies, to be offered to all preK-12 teachers in an online 61 62 format. The Department shall consult with organizations and 63 agencies which can lend aid to this project, including 64 American Village and Alabama Public Television.

65 (3) To the Educational Television Commission for the
66 Madison Avenue Studio and New State House Studio, \$4,000,000.

67 (4) To the Council on the Arts, \$2,100,000. Of this amount, \$1,000,000 shall be used for one-time expenses for 68 deferred maintenance, renovation of existing facilities, or 69 70 expenses associated with ongoing capital projects at the 71 Shakespeare Festival; \$100,000 shall be used for a collaborative community outreach program at the Shakespeare 72 73 Festival; and \$1,000,000 shall be used for one-time expenses 74 for the Carnegie Visual Arts Museum expansion.

75 (5) To the Department of Economic and Community 76 Affairs, \$20,000,000. This appropriation shall be used to 77 deploy broadband infrastructure in rural communities in 78 accordance with the Alabama Broadband Accessibility Fund. 79 Additionally, the funds will be used for a competitive grant 80 program to support online training programs and certifications 81 and job placement assistance in technology fields and reasonable administrative expenses for the administering 82 agency. The funds will be administered by the Alabama 83 84 Department of Economic and Community Affairs in collaboration

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85 with the Alabama Digital Expansion Authority. The Alabama 86 Department of Economic and Community Affairs will award these 87 funds as a part of a public private partnership to increase 88 digital literacy, create technology jobs, and attract 89 businesses to rural Alabama. 90 (6) To the Music Hall of Fame, \$250,000. 91 (7) To the Public Library Service for the Supreme Court 92 Law Library, \$200,000. 93 (8) To the Alabama Department of Revenue, \$50,513,000. Of this amount, \$50,000,000 shall be distributed to the CHOOSE 94 95 Act Fund established by Act 2024-21 of the 2024 Regular Session of the Legislature for the purpose of funding 96 97 Education Savings Accounts; and \$513,000 shall be used for the 98 Education Savings Account administration. 99 (9) To the Alabama Supercomputer Authority, \$2,000,000. Of this amount, \$1,400,000 shall be used for the Data Center 100 Renovation Project and \$600,000 shall be used for the FCC K-12 101 102 Cybersecurity Pilot Project - ASA Match. 103 (10) To the Department of Workforce for a state 104 veterans transition public/private partnership that will 105 provide comprehensive support to include career transition 106 and education and community integration, \$5,000,000. 107 (11) To the Alabama School of Cyber Technology and 108 Engineering for one-time expenses for deferred maintenance and 109 school safety, \$1,000,000. (12) To the Alabama School of Fine Arts for one-time 110 expenses for deferred maintenance and school safety, 111

112 \$1,000,000.

(13) To the Alabama School of Mathematics and Science for one-time expenses for deferred maintenance and school safety, \$1,000,000.

(14) To the Firefighters' Personnel Standards and Education Commission/Fire College, \$1,200,000. Of this amount, \$600,000 shall be used for the Muscle Shoals Regional Training Center Burn Building and \$600,000 shall be used for one-time expenses for deferred maintenance, renovation of existing facilities, or expenses associated with ongoing capital projects.

(15) To the Marine Environmental Sciences Consortium, \$7,000,000. Of this amount, \$5,000,000 shall be used for the new dormitory and \$2,000,000 shall be used for waterline infrastructure improvements.

(16) To the Alabama Institute for Deaf and Blind for one-time expenses for deferred maintenance and school safety, \$1,000,000.

(17) To the Alabama Community College System for one-time expenses for deferred maintenance, renovation of existing facilities, or expenses associated with ongoing capital projects, \$28,861,836.

(18) To Alabama A&M University for one-time expenses
for deferred maintenance, renovation of existing facilities,
or expenses associated with ongoing capital projects,
\$3,222,688.

(19) To Alabama State University for one-time expenses
for deferred maintenance, renovation of existing facilities,
or expenses associated with ongoing capital projects,

(20) To the University of Alabama System for one-time
expenses for increasing research capacity, deferred
maintenance, renovation of existing facilities, or ongoing
capital projects, \$42,087,475.

146 (21) To Athens State University for one-time expenses
147 for deferred maintenance, renovation of existing facilities,
148 or expenses associated with ongoing capital projects,
149 \$3,022,700.

150 (22) To Auburn University for one-time expenses for
151 increasing research infrastructure and instrumentation,
152 technology systems, deferred maintenance, renovation of
153 existing facilities, or ongoing capital projects, \$19,000,000.

154 (23) To Auburn University at Montgomery for one-time
155 expenses for deferred maintenance, renovation of existing
156 facilities, or expenses associated with ongoing capital
157 projects, \$3,062,202.

158 (24) To Jacksonville State University for one-time 159 expenses for deferred maintenance, renovation of existing 160 facilities, or expenses associated with ongoing capital 161 projects, \$3,232,743.

162 (25) To the University of Montevallo for one-time 163 expenses for deferred maintenance, renovation of existing 164 facilities, or expenses associated with ongoing capital 165 projects, \$3,028,237.

166 (26) To the University of North Alabama, \$3,099,716. Of
167 this amount, \$1,599,716 shall be used for one-time expenses
168 for deferred maintenance, renovation of existing facilities,

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169 or expenses associated with ongoing capital projects, and 170 \$1,500,000 shall be used for the Lauderdale County Workforce 171 Center.

172 (27) To the University of South Alabama for one-time 173 expenses for increasing research capacity, deferred 174 maintenance, renovation of existing facilities, or ongoing 175 capital projects, \$11,080,106.

(28) To Troy University for one-time expenses for
deferred maintenance, renovation of existing facilities, or
expenses associated with ongoing capital projects, \$4,612,751.

179 (29) To the University of West Alabama for one-time 180 expenses for deferred maintenance, renovation of existing 181 facilities, or expenses associated with ongoing capital 182 projects, \$3,058,290.

(30) To Tuskegee University for one-time expenses for deferred maintenance, renovation of existing facilities, school security, or expenses associated with ongoing capital projects, \$3,000,000.

Section 2. This act shall become effective immediately upon its passage and approval by the Governor, or upon its otherwise becoming law.
